This is the quarterly report of the City of Winslow Fire Department.

As Fire Chief, I am here to provide the highest-level of excellent service to our internal and external customers.

I have and will continue to do everything in my power to protect and support the men and women under my command. I am fully committed and will continue to be accountable to our community.

My personal and professional intent is to drive the mission of service and safety to the membership for the community that we serve. In working with the City Manager, I implemented a plan to elevate the department's level of services.

Winslow Fire Department is an "all hazards fire department" which means we are dispatched to the following types of calls:

Medical Emergency, Motor Vehicle Accidents, Hazmat Incidents, Water Rescue and Recovery, Structure Fire, Power Lines Down, and Public Lift Assist.

Community Risk Reduction (CRR) Division is a proactive approach aimed at preventing or mitigating the loss of life, property, and resources associated with life safety, fire, and other disasters within a community. The most effective risk-reduction is a combination of prevention and mitigation strategies to prevent community risks.

Winslow Fire Department Community Risk Reduction Division consists of the following: Public Education, Plan Review, Inspection of Fire Hydrants, and applying the 2018 Fire Code to inspections of new and existing buildings.

Highlights of 911 Calls.

Fire

Semi- Truck fire and Car Hauler Fire on I-40 Freeway. Winslow Fite Department, DPS and ADOT responded to both incidents. The crews handle the call by closing the freeway and fighting the fire on the I-40 with over 100-degree heat wearing full structure gear. The Officer in charge filed reports and submitted an invoice to EF Recovery to recoup funds for services provided.

Medical

Winslow Fire Department, Winslow Police Department, and Action Medical responded to several serious domestic violence 911 calls. These calls are the focus of this report due to our citizens and the crewmembers who responds to them. We are talking about behavioral health

- 4. Brown & Brown Law Offices is satisfied that the Congressional Legislation implementing the Agreement is acceptable.
- 5. The city strong supports passage of the Northeastern Arizona Indian Water Rights Settlement Agreement by Congress without any funding for non-tribal entities.

Mayor Cano called the meeting to order. The Pledge was given and the Invocation was offered by Councilmember MacLean. Roll call was taken and Councilmember Nelson was absent. Motion: Moved by Mayor Cano, seconded by Councilmember McKee, to excuse the absent member. Motion passed unanimously with Mayor Cano and Councilmembers Cake, Crisp, MacLean, McKee and Tafoya voting yes.

CALL TO THE PUBLIC

Ann Schmidt commented on Ordinance No. 1420 related to code revisions for planned area development approval procedures that is on the agenda and asked to Council to not approve the proposed amendments.

Heather Pruett discussed the notification process for city meetings, specifically those related to the recent PAD discussions, and thanked Councilmember MacLean for attending Alice's Place recent fundraiser event.

Julia Sells stated that it is difficult for the audience to see presentations on the screen during meetings and requested that either additional screens or handouts be provided. Ms. Sells also commented on the Atlas PAD item that was discussed during the recent zoning hearing.

Councilwoman McKee, who works as a Program Manager at Navajo County Public Health, discussed the county's Safety Town Program that was brought to Winslow schools and thanked Fire Chief Duran and his staff for supporting and participating in the event. Mayor Cano requested that staff reach out to Julia Sells to respond to her questions and comments related to the Atlas project.

Councilmember MacLean referred to a comment made by Ann Schmidt regarding the Planning & Zoning Commission and clarified why the commission was dissolved. Councilmember MacLean also commented on the fact that only five applications have been received since staff began soliciting interest from citizens who would be interested in serving on the commission.

Councilmember McKee, who also attended the League Conference, commented on the networking opportunities that it provides. Councilmember McKee also stated that she intends to be available to the public on Fridays at the new city hall facility in the near future.

Councilmember MacLean announced details of the 9/11 Remembrance Ceremony and the Friends of the Library Book Sale on September 19th – 22nd. Councilmember MacLean also announced that the fun is back at high school football games. Councilmember McKee encouraged citizens to attend the high school soccer games.

After announcing the upcoming annual events including the Standin' on the Corner Festival, the Just Cruis'n Car Show and Inkfest, Mayor Cano discussed the new Little Colorado Route 66 Coalition, who recently held their first meeting in Winslow. Mayor Cano also stated that she is working on both an Indigenous People Day event to be held on October 14th at the theater and a mega corn hole event on October 19th at Eagle Pavilion.

Councilmember MacLean announced that Disco Night will be held on September 21st at the Route 66 Plaza.

B. Future Agenda Items

Councilmember McKee requested that Clear Creek/McHood Park be included on a future agenda to discuss ideas from citizens who have used the park over the summer. Councilmember Cake stated that he would like for the discussion to include park fees.

Councilmember MacLean referred to comments made under Call to the Public and requested that if an agenda item is needed for additional presentation screens, that it be included on a future agenda or that funds be budgeted to purchase them.

Motion passed unanimously with Mayor Cano and Councilmembers Cake, Crisp, MacLean, McKee and Tafoya voting yes.

The City Attorney provided background information from previous Council discussions related to code provisions that needed to be cleaned up pertaining to trailers blocking public right-of-ways or sitting in one location for an extended period of time. The City Attorney referred to the draft language included in the ordinance and explained that new rules have been added to address various concerns that were discussed.

After discussion regarding Section B.7, the Council agreed that the language should read "no more than five (5) travel trailers..." instead of two (2) as shown on the proposed amendment.

There was a lengthy discussion regarding Section B.2 that states vehicles shall be parked only in a side or rear yard of any one lot wherein the City Attorney advised the Council that this is standard language used by other municipalities but it can be taken out or changed if it doesn't work for Winslow. The City Attorney further advised that the Council should think about the concerns that the city is trying to address when considering how the code should read.

Throughout the discussion, the City Attorney and City Manager responded to questions and comments from the Council. The City Attorney discussed proposed language that could be considered including using paved or improved surface instead of side or rear yard. The City Manager also provided information regarding the definition of a side yard.

Councilmember McKee expressed concerns regarding Section B.1 that states that the vehicle shall not be parked on a vacant lot. The City Attorney stated that language referencing a vacant lot can be deleted with public right of way or easement remaining. The Council was in agreement with this change. The Planning & Zoning Hearing Officer also commented on language in the Zoning Code that would address parking a recreational vehicle on a vacant lot.

At the request of Councilmember McKee, the Fire Chief provided information regarding Section B.6 relating to the vehicle being parked in a manner with the fire code.

The City Attorney suggested that this item be tabled since there is not a consensus on Section B.2 so that she and the City Manager can research options and bring it back with language that will address the issues that were discussed.

Motion: Moved by Councilmember MacLean, seconded by Councilmember McKee, to table Item G on the Consent Calendar. Motion passed unanimously with Mayor Cano and Councilmembers Cake, Crisp, MacLean, McKee and Tafoya voting yes.

H. Discussion and/or Action to Approve Ordinance No. 1420
 Amending Section 17.50.050 - Planned Area Development
 Approval Procedures, Subsection B - Preliminary Pad Plan
 Review and Approval, of the Municipal Code, Related to the
 Process for Adoption of Preliminary and Final Planned Area
 Development

Mayor Cano stated that she pulled this item due to comments made during Call to the Public. The Planning & Zoning Hearing Officer explained the code amendment that will modify procedures related to planned area developments in detail. The City Attorney also discussed the amendment and confirmed that there will still be two opportunities to hear from the public.

The Planning & Zoning Hearing Officer commented on the proposed procedure to adopt the preliminary planned area development by ordinance when there is a development agreement attached to it which would assist the developer with financing their project.

At the request of Mayor Cano, the Planning & Zoning Hearing Officer confirmed that there will be two opportunities for citizens to voice their concerns. The City Attorney also discussed the statute requirements regarding development agreements and stated that a public hearing is not required. The City Attorney clarified, however, that it is the

precedence of the Council to allow public comments during agenda items.

Motion: Moved by Councilmember Crisp, seconded by Mayor Cano, to approve Item H – Ordinance No. 1420 amending Section 17.50.050 – Planned Area Development Approval Procedures, Subsection B – Preliminary Pad Plan Review and Approval, of the Municipal Code, related to the process for adoption of Preliminary and Final Planned Area Development. Motion passed unanimously with Mayor Cano and Councilmembers Cake, Crisp, MacLean, McKee and Tafoya voting yes.

COUNCIL CONSIDERATION AND POSSIBLE ACTION

A. Discussion and/or Action Regarding Request for Assistance for Annual Inkfest Event

Laura Parsons provided information regarding the event scheduled for October 12th & 13th and there was discussion regarding this request and the amount budgeted for special events.

Motion: Moved by Councilmember McKee, seconded by Mayor Cano, to donate \$1,000 to Inkfest. Motion passed unanimously with Mayor Cano and Councilmembers Cake, Crisp, MacLean, McKee and Tafoya voting yes. Councilmember McKee thanked Ms. Parsons for continuing this event and commented on the fact that it is a family oriented and safe event for all ages.

B. Discussion and/or Action Regarding Request for Assistance from Little Colorado Medical Center for their Annual 5K Cancer Walk

Ashley Wilkie, Outpatient Services Director at LCMC, provided information regarding the Annual 5K Cancer Walk that will take place on October 26th and stated that any sponsor who donates more than \$200 will have their logo included on the back of the event shirt.

Petra Valez spoke regarding her personal experience with cancer and explained the mission or the Winslow Cancer Support Group. Ms. Valez also stated that funds raised from this event will be donated to the Winslow Cancer Support Group.

After Ms. Wilkie responded to questions and comments from the Council, the City Manager requested that Ms. Wilkie fill out a Special Events Application to coordinate the event with city staff.

Motion: Moved by Councilmember MacLean, seconded by Councilmember Cake, to provide \$500 for the Cancer Walk. Motion passed unanimously with Mayor Cano and Councilmembers Cake, Crisp, MacLean, McKee and Tafoya voting yes.

C. Public Hearing Regarding Home Detention and Continuous Alcohol Monitoring Programs

Mayor Cano opened the public hearing.

The City Attorney highlighted information regarding the program that allows the City Council to establish prisoner work, community restitution work and a home detention program for eligible sentenced prisoners subject to approval of the presiding judge which would be treated the same as confinement in jail. The City Attorney noted that Judge Little has requested that the Council adopt the program via a resolution and advised that a public hearing is required prior to Council making a decision to adopt the programs.

The following individuals spoke regarding the Home Detention and Continuous Alcohol Monitoring Programs:

Theresa Del Mar, speaking as a social worker, noted that this program would allow individuals to work and be productive rather than being locked up at home and stated that she is in favor of this option for non-violent prisoners.

The City Manager and City Attorney responded to a question from Kim Gould regarding whether the programs are successful. Ms. Gould also stated that it is a plus to have someone that can be productive in society.

Deni Thompson inquired if the individuals involved in the program have been to rehab either before, during or after being home monitored. Ms. Thompson also inquired if this is strictly related to alcohol. In response, the City Manager stated that it the judge has the discretion. The City Attorney clarified that the judge creates the program and discussed the eligibility requirements and process for assessing the individual.

D. Discussion and/or Action to Approve Resolution No. 1955 Adopting Home Detention and Continuous Alcohol Monitoring Programs

After the Council commented on Judge Little's philosophy and dedication to provide individuals with various opportunities, including education, Councilmember McKee made a motion to approve

Resolution No. 1955 adopting the Home Detention and Continuous Alcohol Monitoring Programs. The motion was seconded by Mayor Cano and passed unanimously with Mayor Cano and Councilmembers Cake, Crisp, MacLean, McKee and Tafoya voting yes.

E. Discussion and/or Action Regarding October, November and December City Council Meeting Schedule

The City Manager discussed the November and December meeting schedule and advised that staff is recommending that both the November 26th and December 24th meetings be cancelled with the understanding that a special meeting can be called if necessary. The City Manager noted that it may be necessary to have a special meeting to canvass the final results of the November 5th election if they are not available for the November 12th meeting.

Councilmember Crisp stated that she requested that the October meeting schedule be included in the discussion due to the fact that she will not be at the first meeting in October since it is Fall Break. The majority of the Council stated that they will be in attendance for the October 8th meeting.

Motion: Moved by Mayor Cano, seconded by Councilmember Cake, to cancel the November 26th and December 24th regular meetings. Motion passed unanimously with Mayor Cano and Councilmembers Cake, Crisp, MacLean, McKee and Tafoya voting yes.

MOTION TO ADJOURN TO EXECUTIVE SESSION

Motion: Moved by Councilmember Crisp, seconded by Councilmember Cake, to adjourn to executive session. Motion passed unanimously with Mayor Cano and Councilmembers Cake, Crisp, MacLean, McKee and Tafoya voting yes.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

A. Under authority of A.R.S. § 38-431.03(A)(3), A(4) and (A)(7), the City Council may hold an executive session for discussion or consultation for legal advice with the City Attorney and to consider its position and instruct its representatives regarding negotiations for the purchase, sale or lease of real property and terms of development agreements that are the subject of negotiations, all related to the potential development of approximately 1200 acres of City-owned real property located west of State Route 87 and south of Airport Road including discussion regarding draft purchase and sale agreement with Atlas Global Development LLC

Motion: Moved by Mayor Cano, seconded by Councilmember Cake, to move back into regular session. Motion passed unanimously with Mayor Cano and Councilmembers Cake, Crisp, MacLean, McKee and Tafoya voting yes.

<u>DISCUSSION OR POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING ABOVE EXECUTIVE</u> SESSION ITEM

After returning from executive session, Mayor Cano stated that staff has been given direction on how to proceed regarding the executive session item.

COOPERATIVE PURCHASING AGREEMENT BETWEEN CITY OF WINSLOW AND

EDUCATIONAL FURNISHINGS OF ARIZONA, L.L.C., DBA ARIZONA FURNISHINGS

THIS COOPERATIVE PURCHASING AGREEMENT (this "Agreement") is entered into between the City of Winslow, an Arizona municipal corporation (the "City"), and Educational Furnishings of Arizona, L.L.C., dba Arizona Furnishings, an Arizona limited liability company (the "Contractor").

RECITALS

- A. After a competitive procurement process, the State of Arizona ("State") entered into Contract No. CTR067398 dated September 1, 2023, as amended on September 1, 2024 (collectively, the "Mohave Contract"), for office and library furnishings. A copy of the Mohave Contract is attached hereto as Exhibit A.
- B. The City is permitted to purchase such services under the Mohave Contract, at its discretion and with the agreement of the Contractor.
- C. The City and the Contractor desire to enter into this Agreement for the purpose of acknowledging their cooperative contractual relationship under the Mohave Contract and establishing the terms and conditions by which the Contractor may provide the City services as described in this Agreement.

AGREEMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing recitals, the following mutual covenants and conditions, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are acknowledged, the City and the Contractor agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Term of Agreement</u>. This Agreement shall be effective as of the date first set forth above and shall remain in full force and effect until August 31, 2025, unless terminated as otherwise provided in the Mohave Contract.
- 2. <u>Scope of Work</u>. Contractor shall provide to the City the services under the terms and conditions of the Mohave Contract and the Quotation dated August 1, 2024 attached hereto as <u>Exhibit B</u> (the "Quote") and incorporated herein by reference.
- 3. <u>Compensation</u>. Payment to the Contractor for the services or supplies provided shall be made in accordance with the price list and terms set forth in the Mohave Contract and as more particularly set forth in the Quote.
- 4. <u>Rights and Privileges</u>. To the extent provided under the Mohave Contract, the City shall be afforded all the rights and privileges afforded to the State in the Mohave Contract. In

addition to and in no way limiting the provisions set forth in this section, the City shall be afforded all the insurance coverage and indemnifications afforded to the State to the extent provided under the Mohave Contract.

- 5. China. Pursuant to and in compliance with A.R.S. § 35-394, Contractor hereby agrees and certifies that it does not currently, and agrees for the duration of this Agreement that Contractor will not, use: (i) the forced labor of ethnic Uyghurs in the People's Republic of China; (ii) any goods or services produced by the forced labor of ethnic Uyghurs in the People's Republic of China; or (iii) any contractors, subcontractors or suppliers that use the forced labor or any goods or services produced by the forced labor of ethnic Uyghurs in the People's Republic of China. Contractor also hereby agrees to indemnify and hold harmless Winslow, its officials, employees, and agents from any claims or causes of action relating to Winslow's action based upon reliance upon this representation, including the payment of all costs and attorney fees incurred by Winslow in defending such as action.
- 6. All insurance provisions of the Mohave Contract shall apply, including without limitation, the requirement to name all agencies eligible to use the Mohave Contract as an additional insured. Prior to commencing work under this Contract, Contractor shall furnish Winslow with a copy of the current Certificates of Insurance required by the Mohave Contract.

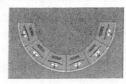

RECOMMENDED MOTION

That the Mayor and Council, by motion, approve the new Axon Contract that includes new Tasers and a contract renewal for body cams and cloud storage. This is a five (5) year pro-rated agreement, with funds to be budgeted from the general fund each FY beginning FY 2025. The total cost requested for approval is \$438,764.29.

DISCUSSION

The Winslow Police Department currently uses an outdated version of Tasers. Our current contract is expiring, and we need to approve a new contract for Tasers, body cams, and cloud storage. It is requested to replace these Tasers with the updated Taser 10. This will include a full maintenance agreement and free cartridge replacement. The total cost of this five (5) year agreement is \$438,764.29, pro-rated over each year. The first-year funding will be allocated FY 2025 funds in the amount of \$45,830.76. Years two, three, and four, will be \$98,233.40 each year, and year five will be \$98,233.33 with the total amount of \$438,764.29 being paid for the fifth and final year.

IMPACT ON BUDGET

\$45,830.76 will be utilized from the current FY 24/25 budget.

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COOPERATIVE PURCHASING AGREEMENT BETWEEN CITY OF WINSLOW AND AXON ENTERPRISE, INC.

THIS COOPERATIVE PURCHASING AGREEMENT (this "Agreement") is entered into between the City of Winslow, an Arizona municipal corporation (the "City"), and Axon Enterprise, Inc., a Delaware corporation (the "Contractor").

RECITALS

- A. After a competitive procurement process, Sourcewell entered into Contract No. 101223-AXN dated February 6, 2024 (the "Sourcewell Contract"), for Axon police equipment and software. A copy of the Sourcewell Contract, Solicitation Number 101223, is attached hereto as Exhibit A.
- B. The City is a participating entity with Sourcewell and can utilize their public procurement tools, including its cooperative purchasing agreements;
- C. The City and the Contractor desire to enter into this Agreement for the purpose of acknowledging their cooperative contractual relationship under the Sourcewell Contract and establishing the terms and conditions by which the Contractor may provide the City services as described in this Agreement.

AGREEMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing recitals, the following mutual covenants and conditions, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are acknowledged, the City and the Contractor agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Term of Agreement</u>. This Agreement shall be effective as of the date last set forth below and shall remain in full force and effect until December 15, 2027, unless terminated as otherwise provided in the Sourcewell Contract.
- 2. <u>Scope of Work</u>. Contractor shall provide to the City the services under the terms and conditions of the Sourcewell Contract and the Quotation Q-599360-45540.960DB, dated September 5, 2024 attached hereto as <u>Exhibit B</u> (the "Quote") and incorporated herein by reference.
- 3. <u>Compensation</u>. Payment to the Contractor for the services or supplies provided shall be made in accordance with the price list and terms set forth in the Sourcewell Contract and as more particularly set forth in the Quote, and not to exceed \$450,000.00.
- 4. <u>Rights and Privileges</u>. To the extent provided under the Sourcewell Contract, the City shall be afforded all the rights and privileges afforded to Sourcewell in the Sourcewell

Contract. In addition to and in no way limiting the provisions set forth in this section, the City shall be afforded all the insurance coverage and indemnifications afforded to Sourcewell to the extent provided under the Sourcewell Contract.

- 5. <u>China</u>. Pursuant to and in compliance with A.R.S. § 35-394, Contractor hereby agrees and certifies that it does not currently, and agrees for the duration of this Agreement that Contractor will not, use: (i) the forced labor of ethnic Uyghurs in the People's Republic of China; (ii) any goods or services produced by the forced labor of ethnic Uyghurs in the People's Republic of China; or (iii) any contractors, subcontractors or suppliers that use the forced labor or any goods or services produced by the forced labor of ethnic Uyghurs in the People's Republic of China. Contractor also hereby agrees to indemnify and hold harmless Winslow, its officials, employees, and agents from any claims or causes of action relating to Winslow's action based upon reliance upon this representation, including the payment of all costs and attorney fees incurred by Winslow in defending such as action.
- 6. <u>E-Verify</u>. To the extent applicable under A.R.S. § 41-4401, the Contractor and its subcontractors warrant compliance with all federal immigration laws and regulations that relate to their employees and compliance with the E-verify requirements under A.R.S. § 23-214(A). Contractor or its subcontractors' failure to comply with such warranty shall be deemed a material breach of this Agreement and may result in the termination of this Agreement by the City.
- 7. <u>Israel</u>. To the extent A.R.S. § 35-393 through § 35-393.03 are applicable, the parties hereby certify that they are not currently engaged in, and agree for the duration of this Agreement to not engage in, a boycott of goods or services from Israel, as that term is defined in A.R.S. § 35-393.
- 8. <u>Insurance.</u> All insurance provisions of the Sourcewell Contract shall apply, including without limitation, the requirement to name all agencies eligible to use the Sourcewell Contract as an additional insured. Prior to commencing work under this Contract, Contractor shall furnish Winslow with a copy of the current Certificates of Insurance required by the Sourcewell Contract.
 - 9. Conflict of Interest. This Agreement may be canceled pursuant to A.R.S. § 38-511.
- 10. Applicable Law; Venue. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Arizona and a suit pertaining to this Agreement shall be brought in Navajo County, Arizona.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF WINSLOW AND

THE HISTORIC ROUTE 66 ASSOCIATION OF ARIZONA FOR THE DEDICATION OF PUBLIC LAND AND BUILDING OF ROUTE 66 MONUMENT

This Agreement is entered into by and between the City of Winslow, Arizona, an Arizona municipal corporation ("City") and the Historic Route 66 Association of Arizona, an Arizona nonprofit organization, (the "Association"). Collectively, the City and the Association are referred to as the "Parties" in this Agreement.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the City of Winslow and the Historic Route 66 Association of Arizona recognize the historical and cultural significance of Route 66, which has played a vital role in shaping the identity and heritage of the region; and

WHEREAS, 2026 will mark 100th anniversary of Route 66;

WHEREAS, in recognition of this milestone, the City and the Association have agreed to collaborate on the construction of a monument to honor the legacy and importance of Route 66 to the area and its people;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants between the Parties, it is agreed as follows:

- 1. DURATION OF AGREEMENT: This Agreement shall be effective upon the date of the last signature below ("Execution Date") and shall continue until the completion of construction and as long as the City maintains the monument as provided in Section 2.1.
- 2. RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE PARTIES:
 - 2.1 City.
 - a. <u>Monument Construction Management</u>. The City agrees to manage the construction of a monument ("Monument") to be located on City-owned land at 523 W. Second Street, Winslow, AZ 86047.
 - b. <u>Provision of Land</u>. The City shall provide the land necessary for the placement of the Monument.
 - c. Maintenance of the Monument. The City shall be responsible for the maintenance of the Monument for as long as it remains in good condition and the costs of maintenance are reasonable, as determined solely by the City. However, the City's obligation to maintain the Monument may be discontinued when it is no longer commercially feasible or practical to do so, or up to fifteen (15) years after the Execution Date of this Agreement,

whichever occurs first. When the City's obligation to maintain the Monument ends, the City will give the Association the option to assume ownership and maintenance of the Monument in its current location, subject to the City's prior written approval and the Association's agreement to maintain it to a safe and visually appealing standard.

2.2 Association.

- a. <u>Engineering Costs</u>. The Association shall cover all engineering costs associated with the design and construction of the Monument.
- b. <u>Construction Costs</u>. The Association shall be responsible for all costs related to the construction of the Monument, including but not limited to materials, labor, and any related expenses.
- c. <u>Transfer of Ownership</u>. Upon completion of the construction of the Monument, the Association shall gift the Monument to the City, thereby transferring all ownership rights to the City.
- 3. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS: The Association shall be responsible for compliance with all applicable federal, state, and local laws and regulations.
- 4. CANCELLATION: The City may terminate this Agreement pursuant to A.R.S. § 38-511.
- 5. ENTIRE CONTRACT; AMENDMENTS: This Agreement represents the entire agreement between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof. This Agreement may not be amended except through an appropriate writing signed by both parties.
- 6. ASSIGNMENT PROHIBITED: The Association shall not assign any rights acquired hereby, without first obtaining the written consent of the City.
- 7. NO DISCRIMINATION: Neither The Association nor its employees or agents will discriminate on the basis of race, religion, handicap, gender, or national origin in hosting the Event.
- 8. IMMIGRATION LAW WARRANTY: The Association warrants compliance with federal immigration law and use of E-Verify. The immigration law warranty set forth in A.R.S. § 44-14401 is incorporated herein by reference in full. A breach of this warranty shall be deemed a material breach of the Agreement that is subject to penalties up to and including termination of the Agreement.
- 9. CONTROLLING LAW. This Agreement is governed by the laws of the State of Arizona.
- 10. LITIGATION. Should litigation be necessary to enforce any term or provision of this Agreement, or to collect any damages claimed or portion of the amount payable under

this Agreement, that all litigation and collection expenses, witness fees, court costs, and reasonable attorneys' fees incurred shall be paid to the prevailing party.

11. TERMINATION. The City may terminate this Agreement if the Monument falls into disrepair and the cost of maintenance becomes commercially unreasonable, or if the City determines that the Monument is no longer in good condition. Either party may terminate this Agreement for convenience, without cause, by providing the other party with at least 60 days' written notice of its intent to terminate. Upon termination for convenience, the Association shall be responsible for any outstanding costs incurred up to the date of termination, and the City shall cease all construction and maintenance activities related to the Monument.

Either party may terminate this Agreement for cause if the other party materially breaches any term or condition of this Agreement and fails to remedy such breach within 30 days of receiving written notice of the breach from the non-breaching party. If the Agreement is terminated for cause, the breaching party shall be responsible for all costs and damages incurred by the non-breaching party as a result of the termination.

Upon termination of this Agreement, whether for convenience or for cause, all rights and obligations of the parties under this Agreement shall cease, except for any obligations that expressly survive termination, including the Association's responsibility to cover any outstanding costs.

12. COUNTERPARTS: This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, and each shall be deemed to possess the full force and effect of the original.

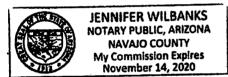

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WINSLOW, ARIZONA, AUTHORIZING THE ADOPTION OF THE 2024 NAVAJO COUNTY HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN UPDATE

- WHEREAS, all jurisdictions within Navajo County have exposure to natural hazards that increase the risk to life, property, environment, the County and local economy; and

ORDINANCE NO. 1421

AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WINSLOW, ARIZONA, AMENDING THE WINSLOW MUNICIPAL CODE, TITLE 5 BUSINESS LICENSES AND REGULATIONS, BY AMENDING 5.12 PEDDLERS, CANVASSERS, SOLICITORS AND TRANSIENT MERCHANTS BY AMENDING SECTION 5.12.010 LICENSE AND PERMIT REQUIRED; 5.12.030 EXEMPTIONS; REPEALING SECTION 5.12.060 SOLICITATION BY RELIGIOUS, PATRIOTIC OR **PHILANTHROPIC** CHARITABLE. ORGANIZATION; ADDING A NEW SECTION 5.12.060 LICENSE FEES; AND ADDING A NEW CHAPTER 5.13 MOBILE FOOD VENDORS RELATED TO THE REGULATION OF MOBILE FOOD VENDORS; ESTABLISHING A PURPOSE; SETTING FORTH DEFINITIONS; PROVIDING FOR PERMIT REOUIREMENTS: ESTABLISHING OPERATIONAL REOUIREMENTS: AND SETTING FORTH VIOLATIONS; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR PENALTIES.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Winslow desires to amend Title 5, Business Licenses and Regulations, Chapter 12, Peddlers, Canvassers, Solicitors and Transient Merchants; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Winslow desires to amend Title 5, Business Licenses and Regulations, by adding a new Chapter 5.13, Mobile Food Vendors; and

WHEREAS, the City is authorized to enact and enforce regulations and zoning codes on peddlers and mobile food vendors that are not otherwise prohibited by law; and

WHEREAS, the City is authorized to regulate mobile food vendors pursuant to applicable law, including Arizona Revised Statutes §§ 9-485, 9-485.01, 9-485.02, and 36-1761; and

WHEREAS, the City recognizes that mobile food vendors create opportunities for economic development and can provide affordable, food at a variety of locations and events; and

WHEREAS, with these regulations, the City ensures that peddlers and mobile food vendors comply with applicable law, including business regulations, building, health, and sanitation codes, as applicable; and

WHEREAS, the City seeks to minimize potential traffic safety threats by mobile food vendors who may impede the free flow of traffic, distract vehicle operators from observing traffic regulations, obstruct the view of pedestrians and vehicle operators, and encourage pedestrians who wish to inquire about services to cross the street in an unsafe and illegal manner; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the City and of the health, safety and welfare of its citizens to enact reasonable regulation for peddlers,

canvassers, solicitors, transient merchants, and mobile food vendors to require compliance with minimum standards for safety and security; and

WHEREAS, that certain document entitled "City of Winslow Peddlers and Mobile Food Vendors Code Update, September 24, 2024" one paper copy and one electronic copy of which are on file with the City Clerk, is hereby declared a public record and said copies are ordered to remain on file with the Clerk.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Winslow, Arizona as follows:

Section I. In General.

The Code of Winslow, Arizona, is amended, to read as set forth in "City of Winslow Peddlers and Mobile Food Vendors Code Update, September 24, 2024" which is hereby adopted and incorporated by reference and attached hereto as Exhibit A.

Section II. Providing for Repeal of Conflicting Ordinances.

All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance or any part of the Code adopted herein by reference are hereby repealed.

Section III. Providing for Severability.

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance or any part of the Code adopted herein by reference is, for any reason, held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions thereof.

Section IV. Providing for Penalties.

Any person, firm or corporation who violates, disobeys, omits, neglects or refuses to comply with or who resists the enforcement of any of the provisions of this chapter shall be deemed, upon conviction thereof, guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor. Each day that such violation shall continue shall constitute a separate offense.

The Winslow Municipal Code, Title 5, Business Licenses and Regulations, Chapter 5.12 – Peddlers, Canvassers, Solicitors and Transient Merchants is hereby amended to read as follows (additions in ALL CAPS; deletions in strikeout):

CHAPTER 5.12 PEDDLERS, CANVASSERS, SOLICITORS AND TRANSIENT MERCHANTS

5.12.010 License and Permit Required

Subject to the provisions of ARS 3-563, it is unlawful for any peddler, solicitor, canvasser, transient merchant, or itinerant vendor, as the same are herein defined, to engage in such business within the corporate limits of the City without first obtaining a permit and license therefor in compliance with the provisions of this chapter. ALL SALES MUST BE CONDUCTED WITHIN THE COMMERCIAL ZONE OF THE CITY UNLESS OTHERWISE EXEMPT.

* * *

5.12.030 Exemptions

The terms of this chapter do not include the acts of persons selling personal property at wholesale to dealers in such property, nor to newsboys, students on school class projects, boy scouts, girl scouts, local church groups, nor to acts of merchants or their employees in delivering goods in the

regular course of business. Nothing contained in this chapter prohibits any sale required by statute or by order of any court or prevents any person from conducting a bona fide auction sale pursuant to law. This chapter INCLUDES RESIDENTS OF THE CITY ENGAGED IN REGULAR OR CONTINUOUS FOOD SALES but excludes residents of the City engaged IN OCCASIONAL OR TEMPORARY food or novelty item sales. This chapter also excludes canvassers, solicitors 'and transient merchants who go door to door (house to house) from requirement that all sales must be done within the Commercial Zone of the City. DOOR-TO-DOOR SALES BY CANVASSERS, SOLICITORS AND TRANSIENT MERCHANTS ARE EXEMPT FROM THE REQUIREMENT THAT ALL SALES MUST BE CONDUCTED IN THE COMMERCIAL ZONE OF THE CITY.

5.12.060 Solicitation by Charitable, Religious, Patriotic or Philanthropic Organizations

Any organization, society, association or corporation desiring to solicit or have solicited in its name money, donations of money or property, or financial assistance of any kind, or desiring to sell or distribute any item of literature or merchandise to persons other than members of such organizations upon the streets, in office or business buildings, by house to house canvass or in public places for a charitable, religious, patriotic or philanthropic purpose exclusively shall be exempt from the provisions of Sections 5.12.010 and 5.12.040; provided there is filed an application on a form to be furnished by the City Finance Director which shall give the following information:

- A. Name and purpose of the cause for which the permit is sought;
- B. Names and addresses of the officers and directors of the organization;
- C. Period during which the solicitation is to be carried on;
- D. Whether or not any commissions, fees, wages or emolument are to be expended in connection with such solicitation and the amount thereof.

Upon being satisfied that such organization, association or corporation is a religious, charitable, patriotic or philanthropic organization, the Finance Director shall issue a permit without charge to such organization, association or corporation to solicit in the City. Such organization, association or corporation shall furnish all of its members, agents or representatives conducting solicitations identification cards stating the name of the organization, the name of the agent, and the purpose of the solicitation.

5.12.070 5.12.060 License Fees.

All peddlers, solicitors, canvassers, transient merchants, itinerant merchants, and itinerant vendors shall:

A. Submit application to the City AND ALLOW AT LEAST (seventy-two (72) hours FOR processing time).

- B. REGISTER THE BUSINESS PURSUANT TO THIS CHAPTER AND OBTAIN A SALES TAX LICENSE AND REMIT CITY SALES TAX IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE APPROPRIATE SECTIONS OF STATE LAW.
- C. IF APPLICABLE, PRODUCE A CERTIFICATE OF HEALTH OR SANITARY EXAMINATION FOR THE OPERATION OF SUCH BUSINESS.
- B. Furnish fingerprints to be taken by City staff and a government issued photo identification for copying by City staff at the time of application.
- C. Pay a one (1) time processing fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) for each peddler, solicitor, canvasser, transient merchant, itinerant merchant and itinerant vendor.
- D. Pay a daily license fee of ten dollars (\$10.00) or an annual fee of fifty dollars (\$50.00).
- E. Conduct all sales within the Commercial Zone of the City.
- EF. Provide written authorization from the property owner approving sales on the owner's property.

SECTION 5.13.010 PURPOSE.

THIS CHAPTER IS ADOPTED TO PROTECT THE HEALTH, SAFETY, AND WELFARE OF THE COMMUNITY OF THE CITY BY ENACTING REASONABLE REGULATION FOR MOBILE FOOD VENDORS, THEIR EMPLOYEES, AGENTS, LESSEES, OR INDEPENDENT CONTRACTORS BY REQUIRING COMPLIANCE WITH MINIMUM STANDARDS FOR SAFETY AND SECURITY.

SECTION 5.13.020 DEFINITIONS.

THE BELOW WORDS AND PHRASES, WHEREVER USED IN THIS CHAPTER SHALL BE CONSTRUED AS DEFINED IN THIS SECTION UNLESS, CLEARLY FROM THE CONTEXT, A DIFFERENT MEANING IS INTENDED. WORDS USED IN THE PRESENT TENSE INCLUDE THE FUTURE TENSE, WORDS IN THE PLURAL NUMBER INCLUDE THE SINGULAR NUMBER, AND WORDS IN THE SINGULAR NUMBER INCLUDE THE PLURAL NUMBER.

- A. "APPLICANT" MEANS THE PERSON WHO APPLIES FOR A PERMIT PURSUANT TO THIS CHAPTER.
- B. "CONTROLLING PERSON" MEANS A NATURAL PERSON WHO EITHER (A) HAS A TEN PERCENT (10%) OR GREATER INTEREST IN THE OWNERSHIP OR EARNINGS OF THE BUSINESS, OR (B) IS ANY OF THE FOLLOWING:
 - 1. AN OFFICER, DIRECTOR, OR ANY STOCKHOLDER WHO OWNS TEN PER CENT (10%) OR MORE, OF A CORPORATION PERMITTEE/APPLICANT:
 - 2. A GENERAL PARTNER OF A LIMITED PARTNERSHIP PERMITTEE/APPLICANT OR PARTNER OF A NON-LIMITED PARTNERSHIP PERMITTEE/APPLICANT;
 - 3. AN OFFICER, PRESIDENT, OR SECRETARY OF A LIMITED LIABILITY COMPANY/CORPORATION PERMITTEE/APPLICANT; OR
 - 4. THE SOLE PROPRIETOR OF A SOLE PROPRIETORSHIP PERMITTEE/APPLICANT.
- C. "DESIGNATED AGENT" MEANS THE PERSON DESIGNATED BY THE PERMITTEE/APPLICANT TO RECEIVE NOTICES FROM THE CITY PURSUANT TO THIS CHAPTER.
- D. "LEGAL PARKING SPACE":

- 1. MEANS AN AREA DESIGNATED FOR VEHICLE PARKING IN THE CITY RIGHT-OF-WAY THAT MAY BE PAVED OR UNPAVED AND MAY BE DELINEATED BY ROAD SURFACE MARKINGS.
- 2. DOES NOT INCLUDE A PARKING SPACE IN A PARKING LOT ON PROPERTY OWNED BY THE CITY.
- E. "MOBILE FOOD UNIT" MEANS A FOOD ESTABLISHMENT THAT IS LICENSED BY THIS STATE, THAT IS READILY MOVABLE AND THAT DISPENSES FOOD OR BEVERAGES FOR IMMEDIATE SERVICE AND CONSUMPTION AND OTHER INCIDENTAL RETAIL ITEMS FROM ANY VEHICLE AS DEFINED IN ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES SECTION 28-101.
- F. "MOBILE FOOD VENDOR" MEANS ANY PERSON WHO OWNS, CONTROLS, MANAGES OR LEASES A MOBILE FOOD UNIT OR CONTRACTS WITH A PERSON TO PREPARE FOODS AND VEND FROM, DRIVE, OR OPERATE A MOBILE FOOD UNIT.
- G. "PERMITTEE" MEANS THE PERSON WHO APPLIED FOR A PERMIT PURSUANT TO THIS CHAPTER AND IN WHOSE NAME SUCH PERMIT WAS ISSUED BY THE CITY PURSUANT TO THIS CHAPTER.
- H. "PERSON" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL, PARTNERSHIP, CORPORATION, ASSOCIATION OR ANY OTHER ENTITY OF WHATEVER KIND OR NATURE.
- I. "RIGHT-OF-WAY" MEANS AS DEFINED IN TITLE 16, CHAPTER 16.06, SECTION 16.06.020 OF THE CITY CODE.
- J. "SEMI-PERMANENT STRUCTURE" MEANS EQUIPMENT, OR ANY DINING AREA, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, TABLES, CHAIRS, BOOTHS, BAR STOOLS, BENCHES, AND STANDUP COUNTERS.

SECTION 5.13.030 COMPLIANCE WITH STATE LICENSING REQUIREMENTS.

IT SHALL BE UNLAWFUL FOR ANY PERSON TO OPERATE A MOBILE FOOD UNIT OR ACT AS A MOBILE FOOD VENDOR WITHOUT HAVING FIRST OBTAINED A VALID LICENSE FROM THE STATE OF ARIZONA DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH SERVICES PURSUANT TO A.R.S. § 36-1761.

SECTION 5.13.040 PERMIT REQUIREMENTS.

A. IT SHALL BE UNLAWFUL FOR A PERSON TO OPERATE A MOBILE FOOD UNIT AT ANY LOCATION WITHIN THE CITY WITHOUT OBTAINING A PERMIT FROM THE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DIRECTOR OR DESIGNEE IN ACCORDANCE WITH CITY CODE. THE MOBILE FOOD VENDOR SHALL COMPLY WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS CHAPTER.

B. A PERMIT ISSUED PURSUANT TO THIS CHAPTER, INCLUDING A RENEWAL OF A PERMIT, IS VALID FOR A PERIOD OF ONE (1) YEAR FROM THE DATE OF ISSUANCE IF THE MOBILE FOOD VENDOR IS IN COMPLIANCE WITH THIS CHAPTER. THE PERMIT IS NONTRANSFERABLE.

SECTION 5.13.050 OPERATIONAL REQUIREMENTS.

- A. IT IS UNLAWFUL FOR ANY PERSON TO OPERATE A FOOD TRUCK THAT DOES NOT MEET THE REQUIREMENTS IN THIS SECTION.
- B. FIRE SAFETY AND INSPECTION. A MOBILE FOOD VENDOR MUST ENSURE THAT ALL MOBILE FOOD UNITS COMPLY WITH THE VERSION OF THE INTERNATIONAL FIRE CODE IN EFFECT AT THE TIME WHEN THE PERMIT IS ISSUED, STATE LAW, AND THE CITY CODE RELATING TO FIRE AND EXPLOSION SAFETY STANDARDS.
- C. A MOBILE FOOD UNIT(S) SHALL BE INSPECTED BY THE CITY'S FIRE DEPARTMENT, OR THE MOBILE FOOD VENDOR SHALL PROVIDE EVIDENCE THAT THE MOBILE FOOD UNIT PASSED A FIRE INSPECTION BY ANOTHER CITY OR TOWN FIRE DEPARTMENT IN THIS STATE WITHIN THE PRECEDING TWELVE (12) MONTHS.
- D. REFUSE, TRASH AND LITTER MAINTENANCE.

A MOBILE FOOD UNIT SHALL:

- 1. PROVIDE A MINIMUM OF ONE FIFTEEN (15) GALLON TRASH RECEPTACLE WITHIN FIFTEEN (15) FEET OF EACH INDIVIDUAL MOBILE FOOD UNIT FOR CUSTOMERS AND EMPLOYEES;
- 2. MAINTAIN AN AREA AROUND THE MOBILE UNIT CLEAR OF LITTER, GARBAGE, RUBBLE, AND DEBRIS; AND
- 3. TRANSPORT THE TRASH FROM THE AREA OF OPERATION TO AN AUTHORIZED WASTE DISPOSAL LOCATION.
- E. NOISE RESTRICTIONS. NOISE LEVELS FROM MOBILE FOOD UNITS SHALL NOT EXCEED THE CITY'S NOISE ORDINANCE STANDARDS PURSUANT TO SECTION 9.08.020.

F. SECURITY.

1. THE MOBILE FOOD UNIT AND THE SURROUNDING VENDING AREA SHALL BE MAINTAINED IN A SAFE AND CLEAN MANNER AT ALL TIMES.

- 2. A MOBILE FOOD UNIT SHALL HAVE ADEQUATE LIGHTING TO ENSURE CUSTOMER SAFETY IN THE VENDING AREA. LIGHTING SHALL BE DIRECTED DOWNWARDS AND AWAY FROM RIGHTS-OF-WAY AND ADJACENT PROPERTIES.
- 3. THE MOBILE FOOD UNIT AND ITS CUSTOMERS SHALL NOT OBSTRUCT THE MOVEMENT OF PEDESTRIANS OR OTHER VEHICLES USING THE SIDEWALK, STREET, ALLEY, OR OTHER PUBLIC RIGHT-OF-WAY.

G. INSURANCE.

- 1. IF THE MOBILE FOOD UNIT OPERATES AN EVENT SPONSORED BY THE CITY OR OPERATES ON PUBLIC PROPERTY, INCLUDING RIGHTS-OF-WAY OR PROPERTY OWNED BY THE CITY, THE MOBILE FOOD VENDOR SHALL OBTAIN INSURANCE NAMING THE CITY AS AN ADDITIONAL INSURED IN AMOUNTS AS REQUIRED BY THE CITY AND IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF A.R.S. TITLE 9, CHAPTER 4, ARTICLE 7.2.
- 2. THE INSURANCE COMPANY ISSUING THE POLICY SHALL BE AUTHORIZED TO ISSUE COMMERCIAL LIABILITY POLICIES IN ARIZONA BY THE ARIZONA DEPARTMENT OF INSURANCE.
- 3. THE POLICY SHALL DESIGNATE BY MANUFACTURER'S SERIAL OR IDENTIFICATION NUMBER ALL MOBILE FOOD UNITS FOR WHICH COVERAGE IS GRANTED.
- 4. THE POLICY SHALL INSURE THE PERSON NAMED IN THE POLICY AND ANY OTHER PERSON USING THE MOBILE FOOD VENDOR WITH THE EXPRESS OR IMPLIED PERMISSION OF THE NAMED INSURED AGAINST ANY LIABILITY ARISING OUT OF THE OWNERSHIP, MAINTENANCE, OR USE OF THE MOBILE FOOD UNIT IN ARIZONA.
- H. LOCATION. A MOBILE FOOD VENDOR SHALL OPERATE A MOBILE FOOD UNIT ONLY IN COMMERCIAL ZONING DISTRICTS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE CITY ZONING CODE AND SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS:
 - 1. RESIDENTIAL AREA. A MOBILE FOOD VENDOR SHALL NOT OPERATE IN AN AREA ZONED FOR RESIDENTIAL USE OR WITHIN TWO HUNDRED FIFTY (250) FEET OF AN AREA ZONED FOR RESIDENTIAL USE, EXCEPT:
 - a. A MOBILE FOOD VENDOR SELLING ONLY ICE CREAM MAY OPERATE ON PUBLIC RIGHTS-OF-WAY IN AREAS ZONED FOR RESIDENTIAL USE; OR

- b. SUBJECT TO APPLICABLE LAWS AND THE CITY CODE, A MOBILE FOOD VENDOR MAY OPERATE ON PRIVATE PROPERTY OUTSIDE OF THE PUBLIC-RIGHT-OF-WAY IN A RESIDENTIAL AREA IF THE MOBILE FOOD VENDOR OBTAINS A SEPARATE AGREEMENT WITH THE PROPERTY OWNER TO OPERATE A MOBILE FOOD UNIT FOR A MAXIMUM OF SIX (6) HOURS WITHIN A TWENTY-FOUR (24) HOUR PERIOD ON THE PRIVATE PROPERTY.
- 2. CITY-OWNED PROPERTY. A MOBILE FOOD VENDOR SHALL ONLY OPERATE IN A LEGAL PARKING SPACE. IF THE MOBILE FOOD VENDOR DESIRES TO OPERATE ON CITY PROPERTY OTHER THAN A LEGAL PARKING SPACE IN A RIGHT-OF-WAY, THE MOBILE FOOD VENDOR SHALL OBTAIN FROM THE CITY:
 - a. A SEPARATE LICENSING FOR USE, SERVICES CONTRACT, OR SIMILAR AGREEMENT, WHICH WILL BE ENTERED INTO AT THE CITY'S SOLE DISCRETION AND APPLICABLE LAW; OR
 - b. A SPECIAL EVENT PERMIT OR SIMILAR PERMISSION IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE CITY CODE.
- 3. PRIVATE PROPERTY. A MOBILE FOOD VENDOR SHALL OBTAIN WRITTEN PERMISSION TO USE ANY PRIVATE PROPERTY WHERE A MOBILE FOOD UNIT IS OPERATING AND SHALL PROVIDE PROOF OF SUCH WRITTEN PERMISSION ON DEMAND BY THE CITY.
- 4. NOTWITHSTANDING THE PERMISSION OF A PERSON OWNING OR HAVING LAWFUL CONTROL OF PRIVATE REAL PROPERTY, A MOBILE FOOD UNIT SHALL NOT REMAIN IN ONE LOCATION ON PRIVATE PROPERTY FOR LONGER THAN NINETY-SIX (96) CONSECUTIVE HOURS, UNLESS THE CITY GRANTS PERMISSION FOR A PERMITTED EVENT GREATER THAN FOUR (4) DAYS. "ONE LOCATION" WITHIN THIS SUBSECTION MEANS A LOCATION WITHIN A PARCEL OF LAND AND INCLUDES MOVEMENTS FROM DIFFERENT PARKED POSITIONS WITHIN THE SAME PARCEL.
- 5. AIRPORTS/PUBLIC TRANSIT. MOBILE FOOD VENDORS SHALL NOT OPERATE AT ANY CITY AIRPORT OR PUBLIC TRANSIT FACILITY UNLESS THE MOBILE FOOD VENDOR HAS ENTERED INTO A SEPARATE LICENSING FOR USE AGREEMENT OR SIMILAR SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH THE CITY, WHICH THE CITY WILL ENTER IN ITS SOLE DISCRETION AND APPLICABLE LAW.
- I. PARKING. A MOBILE FOOD UNIT SHALL COMPLY WITH THIS SUBSECTION AND APPLICABLE LAW AS IT PERTAINS TO PARKING

UNLESS PARKING IS GOVERNED BY A SEPARATE SUBSECTION IN THIS CHAPTER.

- 1. A MOBILE FOOD UNIT SHALL ONLY OPERATE IN A LEGAL PARKING SPACE.
- 2. A MOBILE FOOD UNIT, INCLUDING ANY SEMI-PERMANENT STRUCTURE USED OR ASSOCIATED WITH THE MOBILE FOOD UNIT, MAY USE NO MORE THAN ONE (1) LEGAL PARKING SPACE, UNLESS THE MOBILE FOOD VENDOR HAS A SEPARATE AGREEMENT WITH THE CITY TO USE ADDITIONAL LEGAL PARKING SPACES OR PARKING SPACES ON CITY PROPERTY OTHER THAN RIGHT-OF-WAY.
- 3. NO MOBILE FOOD UNIT EXCEEDING TWENTY-FOUR (24) FEET MAY PARK DIAGONALLY IN A DIAGONAL PARKING SPACE OR PARK IN ANY MANNER THAT OCCUPIES MORE THAN ONE (1) DIAGONAL PARKING SPACE.
- 4. NO MOBILE FOOD UNIT SHALL OPERATE WITH THE SERVING WINDOW FACING STREET TRAFFIC.
- 5. A MOBILE FOOD UNIT SHALL ABIDE BY ALL PARKING REGULATIONS, INCLUDING POSTED TIME LIMITS. IF THERE ARE NO OTHER TIME RESTRICTIONS ON THE USE OF A LEGAL PARKING SPACE, A MOBILE FOOD UNIT SHALL NOT OCCUPY A LEGAL PARKING SPACE FOR MORE THAN SIX (6) HOURS IN A TWENTY-FOUR (24) HOUR PERIOD. "OCCUPY" WITHIN THIS SUBSECTION MEANS WITHIN ONE HUNDRED (100) FEET OF THE PLACE IN WHICH THE MOBILE FOOD UNIT WAS INITIALLY PARKED.
- 6. A MOBILE FOOD UNIT SHALL NOT OCCUPY A LEGAL PARKING SPACE WITH INSUFFICIENT PARKING CAPACITY AS PRESCRIBED BY CITY ZONING CODE AND APPLICABLE LAW AND INCLUDES OCCUPYING A LEGAL PARKING SPACE THAT REDUCES THE NUMBER OF AVAILABLE PARKING SPACES SURROUNDING THE AREA WHICH IS REQUIRED FOR THE PRINCIPAL USE OR USES OF THE PROPERTY ASSOCIATED WITH THE PARKING SPACES AS SET FORTH IN A.R.S. TITLE 9, CHAPTER 4, ARTICLE 7.2.
- 7. A MOBILE FOOD VENDOR SHALL NOT CLAIM OR ATTEMPT TO ESTABLISH ANY EXCLUSIVE RIGHT TO PARK AT A PARTICULAR STREET LOCATION UNLESS THE PARKING SPACE IS PART OF A PERMITTED EVENT.

SECTION 5.13.060 VIOLATIONS; SUSPENSION; REVOCATION.

- A. IT IS A VIOLATION OF THIS CHAPTER FOR ANY PERSON TO PROVIDE FALSE INFORMATION ON ANY PERMIT APPLICATION.
- B. IT IS A VIOLATION OF THIS CHAPTER FOR A PERSON TO OPERATE A MOBILE FOOD UNIT THAT FAILS TO MEET ALL THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS CHAPTER.
- C. IT IS A VIOLATION OF THIS CHAPTER FOR A MOBILE FOOD VENDOR TO FAIL TO DISPLAY THE PERMIT OR OTHER REQUIRED DOCUMENTS, INCLUDING PROOF OF INSURANCE OR FIRE INSPECTION, TO A PEACE OFFICER OR CITY INSPECTOR ON DEMAND.
- D. THE CITY SHALL GIVE WRITTEN NOTICE OF A VIOLATION TO THE PERMITTEE OR DESIGNATED AGENT THAT MAY RESULT IN THE SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF THE PERMIT. THE NOTICE SHALL INCLUDE A DESCRIPTION OF THE VIOLATION, THE STATUTORY OR CODE REFERENCE, HOW THE PERMITTEE CAN COMPLY WITH THE REQUIREMENTS, A DESCRIPTION OF THE PROCESS WHEREBY A HEARING MAY BE REQUESTED, THE TIME LIMIT FOR REQUESTING A HEARING, AND A WARNING THAT FAILURE TO TIMELY REQUEST A HEARING MAY RESULT IN SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF THE PERMIT. THE NOTICE SHALL BE SERVED ON THE PERMITTEE OR DESIGNATED AGENT BY EITHER PERSONAL SERVICE OR REGISTERED/CERTIFIED MAIL. SERVICE OF THE NOTICE SHALL BE DEEMED COMPLETE UPON MAILING TO, OR PERSONAL SERVICE ON, THE PERMITTEE OR DESIGNATED AGENT.
- E. THE PERMITTEE OR DESIGNATED AGENT RECEIVING A NOTICE UNDER THIS SECTION MAY REQUEST A HEARING IN FRONT OF COUNCIL.
- F. IN ADDITION TO ANY PENALTIES SET FORTH IN THIS CHAPTER, A PERMITTEE SHALL BE SUSPENDED IF, DURING THE TERM OF THE PERMIT, THE PERMITTEE OR A CONTROLLING PERSON HAS VIOLATED ANY OF THE PROVISIONS OF THIS CHAPTER. DURING THE SUSPENSION PERIOD, THE PERMITTEE SHALL NOT OPERATE ANY MOBILE FOOD UNIT ASSOCIATED WITH THE SUSPENDED PERMIT. IF A FINE IS ASSOCIATED WITH THE VIOLATION THAT IS THE BASIS FOR SUSPENSION, THE SUSPENSION MAY CONTINUE BEYOND THE PERIOD SET FORTH IN THIS SUBSECTION UNTIL SUCH TIME AS THE PERMITTEE PAYS THE FINE. THE PENALTY FOR A SUSPENSION OF A PERMIT SHALL BE:
 - 1. FOR THE FIRST SUSPENSION OF A PERMIT DURING A 12-MONTH PERIOD, THE PERMIT SHALL BE SUSPENDED UP TO FOURTEEN (14) CALENDAR DAYS AND A FINE OF ONE-HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$100.00) WILL BE IMPOSED.

- 2. FOR THE SECOND SUSPENSION OF A PERMIT DURING A 12-MONTH PERIOD, THE PERMIT SHALL BE SUSPENDED TO A MINIMUM OF FIFTEEN (15) CALENDAR DAYS UP TO A MAXIMUM OF THIRTY (30) CALENDAR DAYS AND A FINE OF TWO-HUNDRED AND FIFTY DOLLARS (\$250.00) SHALL BE IMPOSED.
- 3. FOR THE THIRD SUSPENSION OF A PERMIT DURING A 12-MONTH PERIOD, THE PERMIT SHALL BE REVOKED.
- G. IN ADDITION TO A REVOCATION FOR A THIRD SUSPENSION AS SET FORTH ABOVE, THE CITY MAY REVOKE A PERMIT ISSUED PURSUANT TO THIS CHAPTER IF THE CITY DETERMINES THAT:
 - 1. A MOBILE FOOD UNIT ASSOCIATED WITH THE SUSPENDED PERMIT WAS OPERATED IN THE CITY DURING THE SUSPENSION PERIOD;
 - 2. THE PERMITTEE OR DESIGNATED AGENT OPERATED, OR ATTEMPTED TO OPERATE A MOBILE FOOD UNIT WITHOUT A PERMIT;
 - 3. THE CITY PREVIOUSLY ISSUED THREE (3) OR MORE NOTICES OF SUSPENSION OF VIOLATION WITHIN A SIX (6) MONTH PERIOD;
 - 4. THE PERMITTEE OR CONTROLLING PERSON HAS NOT COMPLIED WITH A PROVISION OF THIS CHAPTER OR HAS FAILED TO PROVIDE INFORMATION AS REQUIRED BY THE CHAPTER;
 - 5. THE APPLICATION FEE, PERMIT FEE, OR ANY TRANSACTION PRIVILEGE TAX HAS NOT BEEN PAID; OR
 - 6. THE PERMITTEE FAILS TO PAY OUTSTANDING FINES OR RESOLVE ANY VIOLATIONS.
- H. IF A PERMIT IS REVOKED PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION, THE PERMIT, AND ITS CONTROLLING PERSON(S) MAY NOT APPLY FOR A PERMIT UNDER THIS CHAPTER FOR A PERIOD OF ONE (1) YEAR FROM THE DATE OF REVOCATION.

ORDINANCE NO. 1422

AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WINSLOW, ARIZONA, APPROVING THE UTILITY EASEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF WINSLOW AND ARIZONA PUBLIC SERVICE COMPANY; AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE MAYOR, CITY MANAGER AND CITY ATTORNEY TO EXECUTE SAID EASEMENT ON BEHALF OF THE CITY AND TO TAKE ALL ACTIONS NECESSARY TO COMPLETE THE TRANSACTION.

WHEREAS, the City of Winslow desires to enter into a Utility Easement with Arizona Public Service Company, an Arizona corporation, permitting Arizona Public Service Company, for utility purposes, including, but not limited to, construct, reconstruct, replace, repair, operate and maintain electrical lines, together with appurtenant facilities and fixtures for use in connection therewith, for the transmission and distribution of electricity to, through, across, and beyond City easement property, as defined in the easement, and to install, operate and maintain telecommunication wires, cables, conduits, fixtures and facilities for purposes of supplying electricity; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Winslow approves of the Utility Easement with Arizona Public Service Company, described above as a necessary public purpose; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WINSLOW, ARIZONA:

<u>SECTION 1</u>. The recitals above are adopted and incorporated as if fully set forth herein.

SECTION 2. The Mayor, City Manager and City Attorney are authorized and directed to execute the Utility Easement between the City of Winslow and Arizona Public Utility Company, attached hereto as **Exhibit A**, a copy of which shall be recorded with the Navajo County Recorder's Office and said recorded Easement shall remain on file with the City Clerk.

SECTION 3. The Mayor, City Manager and City Attorney are authorized to perform all acts necessary to accomplish the purposes described in this Ordinance on behalf of the City.

<u>SECTION 4</u>. If any provision of this Ordinance is for any reason held by any court of competent jurisdiction to be unenforceable, such provision or portion hereof shall be deemed separate, distinct, and independent of all other provisions and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

THE CITY OF WINSLOW-APS UTILITY EASEMENT

THE CITY OF WINSLOW, a municipal corporation of the State of Arizona, (hereinafter called "Grantor"), is the owner of the following described real property located in Navajo County, Arizona (hereinafter called "Grantor's Property"):

SEE EXHIBIT "A" ATTACHED HERETO AND MADE A PART HEREOF

Grantor, for and in consideration of One Dollar (\$1.00) and other valuable consideration, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, does hereby grant and convey to **ARIZONA PUBLIC SERVICE COMPANY**, an Arizona corporation, (hereinafter called "Grantee"), and to its successors and assigns, a non-exclusive right, privilege, and easement, 8 feet in width or as further described in attached exhibits at locations and elevations, in, upon, over, under, through and across, a portion of Grantor's Property described as follows (herein called the "Easement Premises"):

SEE EXHIBIT "B" ATTACHED HERETO AND MADE A PART HEREOF

Grantee is hereby granted the right to: construct, reconstruct, replace, repair, operate and maintain electrical lines, together with appurtenant facilities and fixtures for use in connection therewith, for the transmission and distribution of electricity to, through, across, and beyond Grantor's Property; and install, operate and maintain telecommunication wires, cables, conduits, fixtures and facilities solely for Grantee's own use incidental to supplying electricity (said electrical and telecommunication lines, facilities and fixtures collectively herein called "Grantee Facilities"). Grantee shall at all times have the right of full and free ingress and egress to and along the Easement Premises for the purposes herein specified.

Grantee is hereby granted the right, but not the obligation, to trim, prune, cut, and clear away trees, brush, shrubs, or other vegetation on, or adjacent to, the Easement Premises whenever in Grantee's judgment the same shall be necessary for the convenient and safe exercise of the rights herein granted.

Grantor shall not locate, erect or construct, or permit to be located, erected or constructed, any building or other structure or drill any well within the limits of the Easement Premises; nor shall Grantor plant or permit to be planted any trees within the limits of the Easement Premises without the prior written consent of Grantee. However, Grantor reserves all other rights, interests and uses of the Easement Premises that are not inconsistent with Grantee's easement rights herein conveyed and which do not interfere with or endanger any of the Grantee Facilities, including, without limitation, granting others the right to use all or portions of the Easement Premises for utility or roadway purposes and constructing improvements within the Easement Premises such as paving, sidewalks, landscaping, driveways, and curbing. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Grantor shall not have the right to lower by more than one foot or raise by more than two feet the surface grade of the Easement Premises without the prior written consent of Grantee, and in no event shall a change in the grade compromise Grantee's minimum cover requirements or interfere with Grantee's operation, maintenance or repair.

Grantee shall not have the right to use the Easement Premises to store gasoline or petroleum products, hazardous or toxic substances, or flammable materials; provided however, that this prohibition shall not apply to any material, equipment or substance contained in, or a part of, the Grantee Facilities, provided that Grantee must comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations in connection therewith. Additionally, the Easement Premises may not be used for the storage of construction-related materials or to park or store construction-related vehicles or equipment except on a temporary basis to construct, reconstruct, replace, repair, operate, or maintain the Grantee Facilities.

Grantor shall maintain clear areas that extend: 1) 3 feet from and around all edges of all switching cabinet pads and 2 feet from and around all edges of all transformer pads and other equipment pads, and 2) a clear operational area that extends 10 feet immediately in front of all transformer, switching cabinet and other equipment openings, and 3) a 6 feet by 6 feet hot-stick operating area off the front left corner of all transformers. No obstructions, trees, shrubs, large landscape rocks, fences, fixtures, or permanent structures shall be placed by Grantor within said clear areas; nor shall Grantor install landscape irrigation or sprinkler systems within said clear areas. Landscape irrigation or sprinkler systems installed adjacent to the clear areas shall be installed and maintained so that the transformers, switching cabinets or any other equipment do not get wet by spray or irrigation.

By accepting and utilizing this easement, Grantee agrees that following any installation, excavation, maintenance, repair, or other work by Grantee within the Easement Premises, the affected area will be restored by Grantee to as close to original condition as is reasonably practicable, at the expense of Grantee; and that Grantee shall indemnify Grantor, to the extent required by law, for any loss, cost or damage incurred by Grantor as a result of any negligent installation, excavation, maintenance, repair or other work performed by Grantee within the Easement Premises.

Grantee shall exercise reasonable care to avoid damage to the Easement Premises and all improvements thereon and agrees that following any installation, excavation, maintenance, repair, or other work by Grantee within the Easement Premises, the affected area, including without limitation, all pavement, landscaping, cement, and other improvements permitted within the Easement Premises pursuant to this easement will be restored by Grantee to as close to original condition as is reasonably possible, at the expense of Grantee.

Grantor reserves the right to require the relocation of Grantee Facilities to a new location within Grantor's Property; provided however, that: (1) Grantor pays the entire cost of redesigning and relocating Grantee Facilities; and (2) Grantor provides Grantee with a new easement in a form and location acceptable to Grantee and at no cost to Grantee. Upon the acceptance by Grantee of a new easement and after the relocation of Grantee Facilities to the new easement area, Grantee shall abandon its rights to use the Easement Premises granted in this easement. The easement granted herein shall not be deemed abandoned except upon Grantee's execution and recording of a formal instrument abandoning the easement.

If any of Grantee's electric facilities in this easement are not being used or are determined not to be useful, Grantor may request that the facilities that are no longer needed be removed and that portion of the easement be abandoned. Grantee will execute and record a formal instrument abandoning the easement, or a portion thereof. Any facilities that are determined to still be needed for Grantee's electrical system can be relocated pursuant to the above relocation requirements.

Grantee shall not have the right to transfer, convey or assign its interests in this easement to any individual, corporation, or other entity (other than to an affiliated entity of Grantee or an entity that acquires from Grantee substantially all of Grantee's electric distribution facilities within the area of Grantor's Property) without the prior written consent of Grantor, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld. Grantee shall notify Grantor of the transfer, conveyance or assignment of any rights granted herein.

The covenants and provisions herein set forth shall extend and inure in favor and to the benefit of, and shall be binding on the heirs, administrators, executors, successors in ownership and estate, assigns and lessees of Grantor and Grantee.

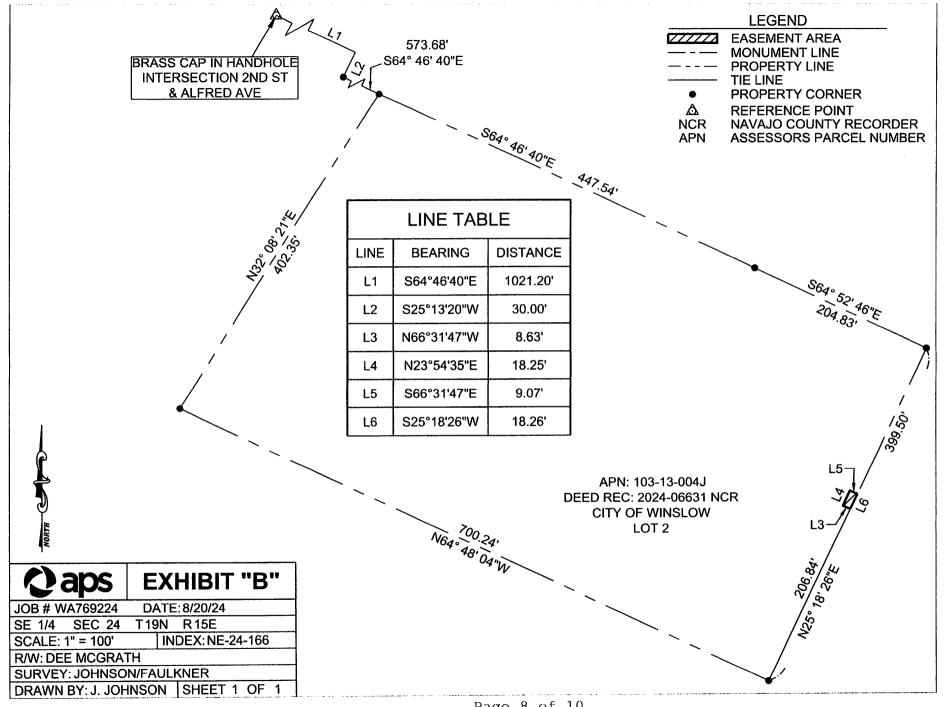

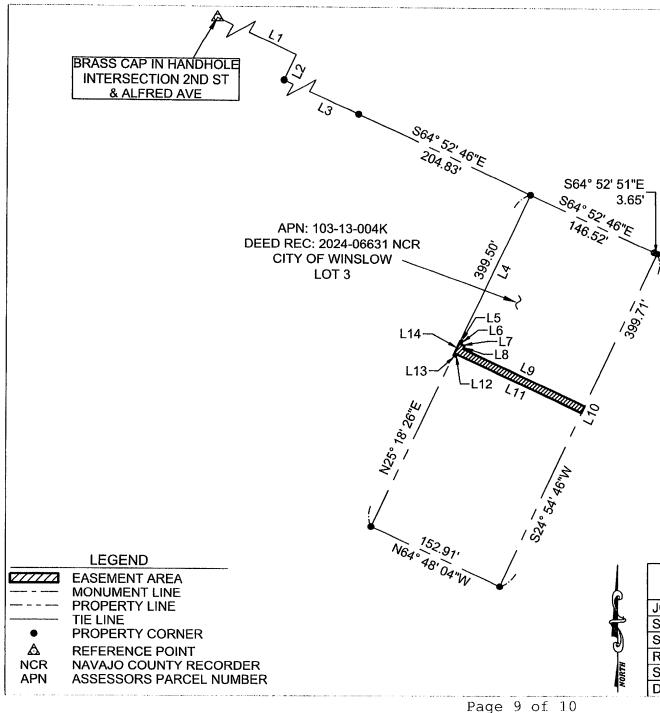

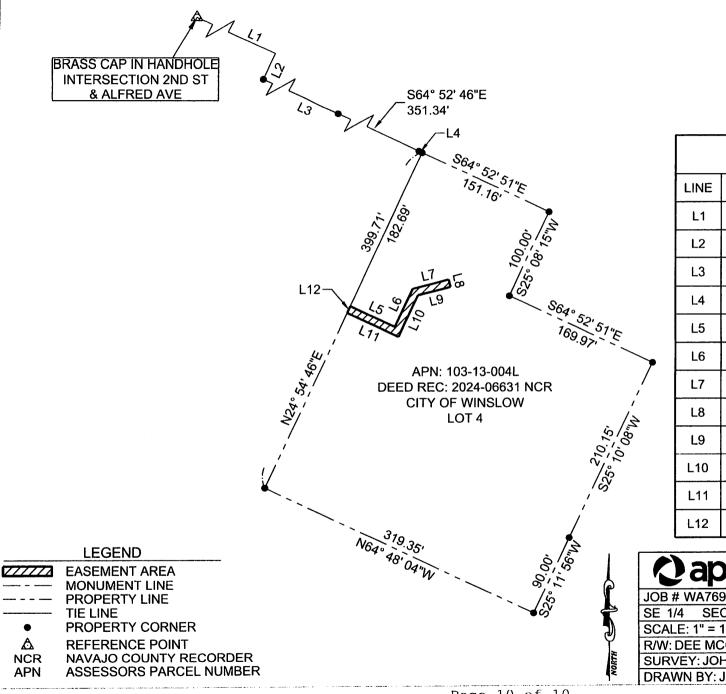
