The meeting was called to order by Chairman Lazzarini at 4:42 p.m. The invocation was given by Chairman Kenna. Roll was called and all Commissioners were present.

## Discussion and/or Action to Approve Minutes – July 15, 2024

Motion: Moved by Commissioner Coolidge, seconded by Commissioner Patton, to approve the November 18, 2024 minutes as presented. Motion passed unanimously with Chairman Lazzarini and Commissioners Coolidge, Kenna, and Patton voting yes.

#### **STATUS REPORTS**

# A. Report by Wiseman Aviation Which May Include Current Airport Activities and Operational Matters

Mr. Orville Wiseman reported steady business operations, noting that fuel sales are expected to finish the year nearly even with 2023 totals. He highlighted an 8% increase in November and a 6% increase in October, despite concerns about the broader economy's impact on general aviation.

Mr. Wiseman also shared that the annual employee Christmas party, held at the Blazing M Ranch in Cottonwood, saw a record attendance of over 50 people. He praised his current staff, noting they are the best team he has ever managed, which is reflected in the overall positive condition of the airport.

#### **B.** Report by U.S. Forest Service

Mr. Enrique Pacheco, Tanker Base Manager, provided an update on tanker base operations. He noted that this is the slow season but expressed optimism about the upcoming year, with hiring efforts underway to fill seasonal positions. He thanked the Commission for touring the tanker base, emphasizing his appreciation for their continued interest in airport operations.

# C. Report by Airport Manager Which May Include Updates from City Regarding Airport

The Airport Manager provided updates on various administrative tasks, including submitting key airport information to Kimley-Horn for the State Airport System Plan (SASP). He acknowledged the support received from Airport Engineer Lance and Wiseman Aviation in supplying essential data. He also expressed appreciation for the collaborative efforts that have contributed to the airport's continued improvements.

### D. Report by Airport Engineer Which May Include Airport Project Updates

The Airport Engineer reported on upcoming and ongoing projects, highlighting two major design efforts slated for FY 2025-2026:

- Apron Reconstruction: The design process will focus on the apron adjacent to Taxiway A, near the tanker base.
- Drainage Improvements: A comprehensive study will be conducted to address flooding concerns near the runway ends. Survey work and elevation mapping will follow to inform the design.

The Airport Engineer also reported that the Precision Approach Path Indicator (PAPI) project for Runway 11/29 is complete and ready for bidding. Due to budget constraints, the project will be phased, with Runway 4/22 scheduled for the next fiscal year.

Additionally, she discussed long-term reconstruction plans for Runway 11/29, emphasizing the need to secure FAA funding due to the project's high cost. She assured the Commission that construction phasing will minimize disruptions during fire season.

#### D. Brief Status Report of the Winslow Arts Council Art Plane Project

The Commission requested that representatives from the Winslow Arts Council be invited to a future meeting to provide a status update on the Art Plane project, as no action has been reported on the project to date.

#### **Current Events and Announcements**

It was recommended that Economic Development Director Jack Fitchett be invited to a future meeting to provide an in-depth update on the RFP's progress and related planning efforts.
