WHEREAS, rape, sexual assault and sexual harassment harm our community and has widespread physical and psychological consequences, such as depression, anxiety, post-traumatic stress disorder, re-occurring reproductive, gastrointestinal, cardiovascular and sexual health problems; and

WHEREAS, over half of women and almost 1 in 3 men have experienced sexual violence involving physical contact during their lifetimes; and

WHEREAS, individuals with disabilities are almost 4 times more likely to be violently victimized and individuals 65 and older are 7 times more likely to be violently victimized; and

WHEREAS, the majority of sexual assaults are not reported to police and the vast majority of rape/sexual assaults go unreported; and

WHEREAS, victim service providers, law enforcement agencies, medical providers and court personnel have made significant contributions to support victims and their family members in the healing process; and

WHEREAS, expanding prevention education, increasing awareness, building a strong continuum of victim services, and holding perpetrators accountable can create a safer community.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved, that the Mayor & City Council of the City of Winslow, do hereby proclaim the month of April 2025 as Sexual Assault Awareness Month in the City of Winslow and encourage all citizens, parents, governmental agencies, public and private institutions, businesses, hospitals and schools to join together and raise awareness about sexual assault, provide support for survivors and strive to achieve a community where sexual assault victims have a clear path to justice and our community, families and children are protected.

WHEREAS, April 2025 marks the 57th Anniversary of Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968, known as the Civil Rights Fair Housing Act; and

WHEREAS, this Act provides equal housing opportunity for all Americans regardless of race, color, religion, sex or national origin, as well as to ensure fair practice in the sale, rental or financing of property; and

WHEREAS, the Fair Housing Amendments Act of 1988 added new rights, remedies and monetary penalties, and strengthened its enforcement procedures; and

WHEREAS, the Fair Housing Amendments Act seeks to provide equal housing opportunities to affirmatively further housing choices, to eliminate legal barriers to equal housing and to emphasize equal housing as a fundamental human right for all; and

WHEREAS, individuals in the city have the right to choose where to live without discrimination based on race, color, religion, age, sex, disability, gender identity, familial status or national origin; and

WHEREAS, the City of Winslow fully supports the intent and purpose of the Federal Fair Housing Act, local fair housing laws and follows policies and practices in order to achieve its goal.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Mayor and City Council do hereby proclaim the month of April 2025 as "FAIR HOUSING MONTH" in the City of Winslow to establish an inclusive community committed to fair housing and to promote appropriate activities by private and public entities intended to provide or advocate for equal housing opportunities for all residents and prospective residents of the City of Winslow.

WHS/OTM Quarterly Report to COW in April 2025 For First Quarter 2025 (January through March 2025)

From Ann-Mary Lutzick, Director of the Old Trails Museum (OTM): Thank you for your attention, and feel free to contact me by phone or email (below) if you have any questions, comments, or suggestions.

Publications/Public Programs/Outreach

Annual History Highlight: OTM will host its free 2025 History Highlight on Saturday, April 19, at 5 pm in the La Posada Hotel Ballroom. Kevin Schindler, the historian at Lowell Observatory, will present Dark Skies over Arizona. Using beautiful astronomical images, he will illustrate the benefits of dark skies, how Arizona has helped lead the charge to protect them, and how we all can do our part in reducing artificial light pollution.

<u>Past and Present: Winslow</u>: On February 12, OTM Director Ann-Mary Lutzick gave a book talk to 13 Rotarians at their weekly meeting at Bojos. *Past & Present: Winslow* is available at the museum for \$25 and through the OTM Online Store (\$30). OTM appreciates the Rotary's ongoing support, which includes repeat ads in the annual calendars like this year's *Winslow in the 1960s*, which is available at the museum (\$12), the OTM Online Store (\$15), and several outlets around town.

<u>Winter OTM eNEWS</u>: The latest edition of OTM's quarterly online newsletter went out on February 19. You can find it on the OTM Website on the "Newsletters" page, where you can also sign up to receive it directly to your inbox.

<u>Facebook Page</u>: OTM did posts in February and March to celebrate African American History and Women's History Months, respectively. The posts invited viewers to check out the related exhibits on the OTM Website, *African Americans in Winslow* and *Women of Winslow*, and to contact OTM if they would like to contribute their families' stories and photos to additional exhibit panels.

2024 Visitation Statistics: OTM hosted 2,699 visitors at the museum and 10,110 visitors at its off-site exhibits, including A Hubbell Trading Post History at the Winslow Visitors Center and Journeys to Winslow in the Kenna Courtyard and Affeldt Mion Museum. OTM hosted 114 attendees at its public programs, which included the 2024 History Highlight, The Atomic Legacy on Route 66 program, WHS Annual Meeting, and Past & Present: Winslow Book Talk at La Posada. People also "visited" the museum's online outlets, including the OTM Website (35,384 visitors, with 2,577 views of the History of Winslow short film) and Facebook page (1,542 followers). The museum currently has 8 volunteers and 9 board members, who contributed 1,808 hours in 2024 (\$60,550 in-kind value).

Governance & Operations

OTM Building: On March 14, OTM Director Lutzick submitted an application to the Historic Route 66 Association of Arizona for a \$50,000 Arizona Route 66 grant to develop the OTM Collections Center. OTM thanks City Manager David Coolidge for his letter of support. Decisions will go out in May.

The Vault Project: OTM hired Cody Runyan of Backwoods Renovations to install additional shelving in the OTM Vault for more collections storage space. OTM Volunteer Curtis Hardy donated the labor cost.

A. Presentation of Employee Service Awards

The Human Resources Manager announced the employees who were receiving awards and presented them to those who were in attendance.

B. Quarterly Northland Pioneer College (NPC) Report Which May Include Update on the 2025-2030 Strategic Planning Process, Introduction of New NPC President and Little Colorado Campus Activities

Mayor Cano noted that the Executive Director of NPC Friends & Family could not be at the meeting to provide her report and announced that registration is now open for summer courses that are being offered at no cost.

C. Quarterly Hospital Report Which May Include Update Regarding Little Colorado Medical Center (LCMC) Activities

After stating that several members of LCMC staff participated in the Walk the Dog Program today (March 25th), CEO Travis Udall, thanked the Mayor & Councilmembers for their dedication to public service. Mr. Udall also commented on the hospital's efforts to gain community trust and stated that the hospital has been experiencing growth and volume increase.

Mr. Udall discussed the confusion related to Medicare and Medicaid cuts and provided the status of the purchase of a new MRI machine. Mr. Udall then provided updates on new programs that are now available, including Pain Management, the Tele-Stroke Program and the Behavioral Health Clinic, and also reported that the wait time in the ER has decreased by one hour.

CV 6417-300, CV 6417-400) and status of Northeastern Arizona Indian Water Right Settlement Agreement and pending legislation related thereto, ongoing negotiations with the Tribes, potential involvement in other water rights litigation and any other legal issues regarding the City's water supply

STATUS REPORTS

A. Verbal Status Report on Current City Activities by City Manager Which May Include Project and Legislative Update

The City Manager's legislative update included information regarding the following proposed bills:

- HCR2021: municipal food tax
- SB1208: home consumption items; tax exemption
- SB 1318/SCR1014: income tax rate; reduction; surplus
- HB2118: sourcing; business location
- SB1229: starter home restrictions
- SB1353: municipal development; permits; review

The City Manager then provided detailed updates regarding the following grant funded projects and programs:

- New water tank
- Pocket Parks and 9/11 Park Renovations (on hold due to funding freeze)
- Ramada project and accessibility upgrades to Tom Harris Field
- Farmers Market Grant

In conclusion, the City Manager commented on the recent freeway closures due to weather conditions and stated that a meeting has already been scheduled with ADOT to discuss appropriate adjustments to make next winter's closures more efficient.

The City Manager also responded to comments from Mayor Cano, who expressed the need to include notifications to stranded motorists when the freeway is closed. Councilmember MacLean requested that a report showing the status of approved capital projects be provided to the Council.

B. Monthly Financial Report by Finance Director Which May Include Balances, Expenditures and Revenues in All Funds

The Finance Director began by stating that two-thirds of the fiscal year has passed. The Finance Director then highlighted information from his written report for the month of February that included city wide revenues and expenditures, as well as General Fund, HURF Fund and Enterprise Funds revenues and expenditures and stated that the city remains on track to finish the fiscal year within expected parameters.

At the request of Councilmember MacLean, the Finance Director explained why some of the funds appear to be operating in the red.

C. Quarterly Report by Fire Chief Which May Include Department Overview and Incident Response & Special Operations

The Fire Chief referred to his written report included in the packet and explained that the Fire Department is an "all hazards fire department" which means they are dispatched to not only structure fires and hazmat incidents, but also to medical emergencies, motor vehicle accidents, water rescue and recovery, power lines down and public lift assists.

After explaining the key responsibilities of the Community Risk Reduction (CRR) Division, the Fire Chief commented on recent and ongoing construction projects and discussed the 911 call report for the 2024 calendar year. Incident response and special operations for the quarter included a vehicle recovery from Clear Creek, a major motor vehicle accident within city limits and a major house fire in downtown Winslow.

Councilmember McKee thanked the Fire Chief for providing informative and transparent reports.

The City Attorney also explained details of Ordinance No. 1426 to remove the dual license requirement that is being presented for consideration based on previous direction from the Council.

The City Attorney clarified that a Conditional Use Permit, which is heard by the Planning & Zoning Hearing Officer, would be required if an operator was interested in opening a recreational marijuana facility. Councilmember MacLean stated that he would like for the dual license requirement to remain in the code. Councilmember Crisp referred to the potential economic development impact of removing the requirement and stated that not having a facility is harming patients who benefit from the use of medical marijuana.

Motion: Moved by Mayor Cano, seconded by Councilmember Crisp, to approve Item J, Ordinance No. 1426. Motion passed with Mayor Cano and Councilmembers Crisp, McKee, Salazar and Tafoya voting yes and Councilmember MacLean voting no.

ADJOURNMENT

Motion: Moved by Councilmember MacLean, seconded by Mayor Cano, to adjourn at 8:22 p.m. Motion passed unanimously with Mayor Cano and Councilmembers Crisp, MacLean, McKee, Salazar and Tafoya voting yes.

Little League Agreement

WHEREAS the City of Winslow and Winslow Little League, Inc. wish to provide worthwhile athletic activities for the youth and adults of the City of Winslow, the City of Winslow (hereinafter City) and the Winslow Little League, Inc. (hereinafter Little League) agree as follows:

- 1. The term of this agreement shall be for one year from the date of its execution.
- 2. The City shall maintain the Little League Girl's Fast Pitch Softball field, Little League field, Vargas Baseball field, Val Lopez Multi-Purpose complex, Philly's field, and Tom Harris field by cutting, edging, and watering the turf as needed and by dragging the infield once a game day during the regular season and once a game day during the tournament play.
- 3. The City shall install the inserts for new bases and install the home plates, and pitcher's mound rubbers.
- 4. The City shall provide free usage of all ball fields and provide field lighting necessary to conduct evening league and tournament games and will also provide free utilization of all concession stands and associated utilities.
- 5. The City shall also maintain and repair all fences, buildings, stands, and lighting.
- 6. The City shall also provide an amount to the Little League as determined to be appropriate and within the financial resources of the City for the fiscal year 2025/2026.
- 7. The City of Winslow Public Works Director shall make the final decision regarding the level of services to be provided for each field and the playability of each field.
- 8. Nothing in this agreement shall compel the City to provide services or pay costs for the benefit of the Little League in the event that the City does not have the financial ability to do so. Nor does anything in this agreement preclude the City from exercising administrative authority to determine which portion of the City's funding shall be used to perform the services of this agreement.
- 9. This agreement does not create a third-party beneficiary and no third party shall have the right to enforce the terms hereof.
- 10. The Little League shall elect its Board of Directors to organize and administer the operation of all divisions of the Winslow Little League.
- The Little League shall provide to the City Finance Director, on an annual basis, a budget of the intended expenditures of the Little League and provide an accounting of all City funds budgeted and provided to the Little League by the City at the end of each season.

- 12. The Little League shall provide to the Public Works Director a schedule of all dates for opening ceremonies and for all games and for all play-offs at least two weeks prior to the opening ceremonies.
- 13. The Little League shall advise the Public Works Director as soon as possible of the cancellation of any games and at least two days in advance of the rescheduling of any games.
- 14. The Little League shall also schedule, at least two weeks in advance, all of the above named fields for practice purposes.
- 15. At the beginning and during the season and throughout tournament play, the Little League shall be responsible for the operation and cleaning of the concession stands and shall retain all profits therefrom. The Little League shall be responsible for all federal, state, and local taxes which may arise from the concession stands. If the Little League has employees, the Little League shall be responsible for all employment benefits and shall comply with all state and federal statutes relating to said employment. At the end of the season, Little League shall be responsible for cleaning the concession stands.
- 16. The Little League shall purchase all concession stand inventory it intends to use and secure said inventory.
- 17. The Little League shall purchase field materials such as pitching mound soil, diamond dry and other such materials.
- 18. The Little League shall purchase and maintain all equipment including new bases, home plates, and pitcher's mound rubbers.
- 19. The Little League shall further maintain and repair the inside of the Little League concession stand, the team signs anchored to the Little League fence, and all public address systems for little league and senior league games.
- 20. The Little League shall also prepare the field for all regular little league and senior league games in the little league fields, fast pitch softball field, and the Vargas Field by lining the batter's box and base paths as needed.
- 21. The Little League will pick up the trash in the stands, around the fields, in the dugouts, and outside the concession stands and place the trash in the City-provided trash containers following each day of practice or play.
- 22. The Little League shall be responsible to maintain a safe, secure, and sportsman-like environment during practice, regular season, and tournament play and shall work closely with the Winslow Umpires Association to implement this provision.

- 23. The Little League shall be responsible for all arrangements for umpires at the above referenced practice, regular season, or play-off games as determined by the Little League and shall be wholly responsible for the payment of benefits owed to the umpires.
- 24. The Little League shall hold the City harmless from any and all liability arising from its use of the fields and provide to the City a copy of the public liability insurance naming the Winslow Little League and the City of Winslow as co-insured with a coverage amount of not less than \$1,000,000.00. The Little League further agrees to hold harmless the City and defend the City against all claims and to reimburse the City for its attorney's fees and costs incurred in the defense of said claims.
- 25. In the event of a breach of this agreement, the non-breaching party shall give 24-hours notice to the breaching party and the breaching party shall have 24 hours to cure said breach.
- 26. In the event of a breach which results in litigation, the non-breaching party shall be entitled to recover its costs and attorney's fees.
- 27. In the event of a disagreement arising from this contract, the parties agree to submit that matter to arbitration that shall be binding and non-appealable.
- 28. In the event a notice is required to be given under the terms of this agreement, the notice to the City shall be given to the City Public Works Director at 21 N. Williamson Avenue, Winslow, Arizona 86047. Notice required to be given to the Little League pursuant to the terms of this agreement shall be given by mail to the following address:

RECOMMENDED MOTION

That the Mayor and Council, by motion, approve Resolution No. 1971 approving a property split for real property identified as Navajo County APN 103-26-001B located at 1500 N. Park Dr. and zoned in the commercial district.

DISCUSSION

The Subject Property is located on the east side of North Park Drive, South of the Travelodge/I-40 freeway and future Circle K, and across the street from the Safeway grocer-anchored shopping center and is zoned in the Commercial district. There is an existing McDonald's leasing a portion of the larger parcel. Although the City Council approved a lot split for this parcel on November 12, 2024, it was discovered shortly thereafter that there was an error with that request, so the split was never recorded at the request of the applicant. This report now addresses the applicant's corrected and resubmitted split request for the same parcel. The image below shows the assemblage of the parcels in red outline within the context of the surrounding area, see Figure 1 – Aerial Image, below:

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The lot split application intends to split the McDonald's parcel in four so that two new properties are created for development when combined with the new extension of Desmond Street providing access. This split will also take the existing private ingress/egress and utility easement and create a right-of-way parcel for the new Desmond Street extension. Although the split is resulting in four different parcels, one of the four parcels is only for right-of-way to be dedicated as Desmond Street to the city and does not constitute a lot from the perspective of Subdivision Regulations.

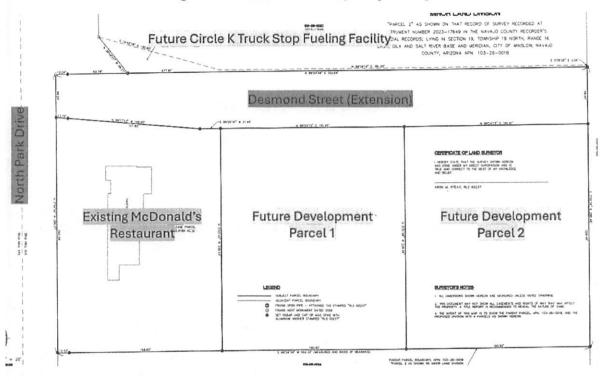


Figure 2 - Parcels Created by Proposed Split

They are also required to be sealed by a licensed registrant which they were. Based on the application provided, it appears that all of these documents have been correctly provided by the applicant, and the lot split further meets the requirements of the Commercial zoning district for within it is located.

The Zoning Hearing Officer heard this request at its March 3, 2025 public hearing and recommends approval to the City Council of the Lot Split request, subject to the exhibits provided by the applicant, as sealed by the registered land surveyor.

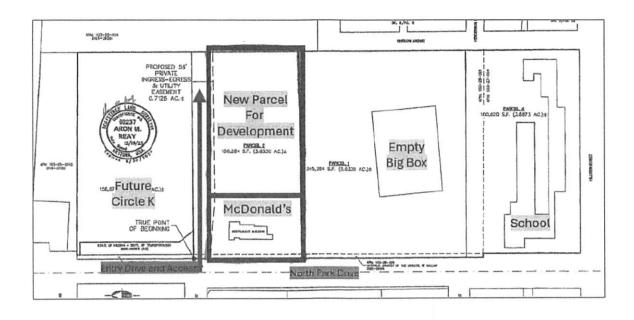

ORDINANCE NO. 1427

AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WINSLOW, ARIZONA, AMENDING THE CODE OF THE CITY OF WINSLOW, ARIZONA, TITLE 2 ADMINISTRATION, CHAPTER 2.22 ARTS COUNCIL. AMENDING SECTION 2.22.020 MEMBERSHIP-NUMBER, QUALIFICATIONS, APPOINTMENT, REMOVAL, FILLING VACANCIES. SECTION 2.22.030 MEMBERSHIP-TERMS OF OFFICE, SECTION 2.22.040 ORGANIZATION-ADOPTION OF RULES-RECORDS-CONFLICTS OF INTEREST-OPEN MEETING LAW, AND SECTION 2.22.090 ANNUAL REPORT AND BUDGET RELATED TO THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE ARTS COUNCIL AND THE ARTS COUNCIL PROPOSED BUDGET SUBMISSION RECIPIENT; AND AMENDING THE CODE OF THE CITY OF WINSLOW, ARIZONA, TITLE 17 ZONING, CHAPTER 17.96 PRESERVATION OF HISTORIC SITES AND STRUCTURES, BY AMENDING SECTION 17.96.020 CREATION OF HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMISSION RELATED TO THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMISSION.

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined it is in the best interest of the City to reduce the membership of the City of Winslow Arts Council from nine members to five members;

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the City to reduce the membership of the City of Winslow Historic Preservation Commission from seven members to five members;

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the City to for the City of Winslow Arts Council to provide their annual report and proposed budget to the City Manager;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Winslow, Arizona, as follows:

Section 1. In General.

The City of Winslow Municipal Code is hereby amended by amending Title 2 <u>Administration</u>, Chapter 2.22 <u>Arts Council</u>, by amending Section 2.22.020 <u>Membership-Number</u>, <u>Qualifications</u>, <u>Appointment</u>, <u>Removal</u>, <u>Filling Vacancies</u> to read as follows (new text in ALL CAPS; deletions in <u>strikethrough</u>):

2.22.020 Membership-Number, Qualifications, Appointment, Removal, Filling Vacancies

The membership of the City of Winslow Arts Council shall consist of nine FIVE (9) (5) members who shall be appointed by the City Council. Two (2) of the nine (9) members of the Arts Council shall be nonvoting youth members of high school age. THE Seven FIVE (7) (5) of the nine (9) members shall serve for three (3) year terms, except that members may be appointed to

shorter terms to provide staggered terms among members of the Arts Council. Members may not serve more than three (3) consecutive terms without an absence from the Council of at least three (3) years. In order to be appointed as a member of the Council, the adult appointee must be a qualified elector of the City, a resident of the City of Winslow and be appointed by the Mayor and Council. The recording secretary of the Council shall notify the City Council whenever any member is absent from three (3) consecutive regular meetings; three (3) such absences without cause shall be sufficient for the Council to declare a vacancy in that office. When a member moves from the City, his or her office shall at once become vacant. Vacancy shall be filled for unexpired terms in the same manner as prescribed for the original appointments as set out above.

The City of Winslow Municipal Code is hereby amended by amending Title 2 <u>Administration</u>, Chapter 2.22 <u>Arts Council</u>, by amending Section 2.22.030 <u>Membership-Terms of Office</u> to read as follows (deletions in strikethrough):

2.22.030 Membership-Terms of Office

Appointment of seven (7) of the nine (9) Arts Council members shall be for a period of three (3) years each, with the terms of the members so staggered that no more than three (3) will expire in one (1) year. In the event of the death, resignation, or removal of a member, the vacancy may be filled for only the unexpired portion of the term. The terms of all members shall extend until their successors are qualified.

Two (2) of the nine (9) Arts Council members, which are the youth members, shall be appointed for one (1) year terms, commencing April 1st of each year. The youth members shall be ex officio, nonvoting members.

The City of Winslow Municipal Code is hereby amended by amending Title 2 <u>Administration</u>, Chapter 2.22 <u>Arts Council</u>, by amending Section 2.22.040 <u>Organization-Adoption of Rules-Records-Conflicts of Interest-Open Meeting Law</u> to read as follows (new text in ALL CAPS; deletions in <u>strikethrough</u>):

2.22.040 Organization-Adoption of Rules-Records-Conflicts of Interest-Open Meeting Law

The City of Winslow Arts Council at its first meeting shall elect officers and fix the time and place for regular meetings. A majority of four THREE (4) (3) voting members of the Council shall constitute a quorum. Nonvoting youth members shall not be counted in the calculation of a quorum. A quorum shall be required to transact any Council business or take official action including, but not limited to, adoption of policy, recommendations, reports, or minutes. The Council shall adopt rules and procedures for the transaction of business, subject to approval by the City Council, and shall keep a record of the transactions, findings, recommendations, and determinations. A copy of the Council's records shall be kept in the office of the City Clerk and such record shall be open to public inspection. The members of the City of Winslow Arts Council shall be subject to the State conflict of interest statutes and subject to the Arizona Open Meeting Law.

The City of Winslow Municipal Code is hereby amended by amending Title 2 <u>Administration</u>, Chapter 2.22 <u>Arts Council</u>, by amending Section 2.22.090 <u>Annual Report and Budget</u> to read as follows (new text in ALL CAPS; deletions in strikethrough):

2.22.090 Annual Report and Budget

The Council, not less than one hundred twenty (120) days prior to the beginning of the fiscal year, shall submit to the City Council of the City of Winslow an annual report setting forth the state and progress of its work, a financial report including the amounts of its receipts and expenditures, and such other information as it may deem proper and as may be requested by the City Finance Director and in the form designated by the City Finance Director. The Council shall also submit a proposed budget to the City Council MANAGER annually as prescribed by the City Finance Director.

The City of Winslow Municipal Code is hereby amended by amending Title 17 Zoning, Chapter 17.96 Preservation of Historic Sites and Structures, by amending Section 17.96.020 Creation of Historic Preservation Commission to read as follows (new text in ALL CAPS; deletions in strikethrough):

17.96.020 Creation of Historic Preservation Commission

A. Membership.

The Winslow Historic Preservation Commission shall be composed of seven FIVE (7)
 (5) members, appointed by the Mayor and Council, all of whom have demonstrated interest, experience or knowledge in one of the following: history, architecture, planning, archaeology, historic archeology, real estate, historic preservation, law or related field.

Section 2. Providing for Repeal of Conflicting Ordinances.

All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance or any part of the Code adopted herein by reference are hereby repealed.

Section 3. Providing for Severability.

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance or any part of the Code adopted herein by reference is, for any reason, held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions thereof.

ORDINANCE NO. 1429

AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WINSLOW, ARIZONA, AUTHORIZING THE ACQUISITION OF CERTAIN REAL PROPERTY IN THE CITY FOR PUBLIC USE; AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE MAYOR, CITY MANAGER AND CITY ATTORNEY TO ACQUIRE TITLE TO CERTAIN REAL PROPERTY ON BEHALF OF THE CITY AND TO TAKE ALL ACTIONS NECESSARY TO COMPLETE THE TRANSACTION.

WHEREAS, the continued growth and development of the City of Winslow requires the acquisition of certain real property for use by the City, and

WHEREAS, the property owners, Front Street Mercantile, LLC, an Arizona limited liability company, Front Street Mercantile East, LLC, an Arizona limited liability company, and Front Street Mercantile West, LLC, each represented by Member, Stephen Thompson, wish to sell real property, as described in **Exhibit A** attached hereto and made a part hereof, to the City for a public use; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Winslow finds that acquisition of the real property described is necessary for a public purpose, and it is in the public interest to acquire such property, and

WHEREAS, the parties have reached an agreement regarding the terms and conditions of the purchase which are included in the Real Estate Purchase Agreement, on file with the City Clerk as **Exhibit B**, to be executed by both parties.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WINSLOW, ARIZONA:

<u>SECTION 1</u>. The recitals above are adopted and incorporated as if fully set forth herein.

SECTION 2. The Mayor, City Manager and City Attorney are authorized and directed to acquire title to and possession of the real property described in **Exhibit A** and enter into the Real Estate Purchase Agreement on file with the City Clerk as **Exhibit B**, and to comply with the terms of said Agreement, which shall remain on file with the City Clerk.

SECTION 3. If any provision of this Ordinance is for any reason held by any court of competent jurisdiction to be unenforceable, such provision or portion hereof shall be deemed separate, distinct, and independent of all other provisions and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4. The Mayor, City Manager and City Attorney are authorized to perform all acts necessary to acquire said property for the purposes described in this Ordinance on behalf of the City.

REAL ESTATE PURCHASE CONTRACT

The parties to this Real Estate Purchase Contract (the "Contract") are Front Street Mercantile, LLC, an Arizona limited liability company, Front Street Mercantile East, LLC, an Arizona limited liability company, and Front Street Mercantile West, LLC, an inactive Arizona limited liability company (hereinafter "Seller"), and the City of Winslow, Arizona, a municipal corporation organized under the laws of the State of Arizona, (hereinafter "Buyer"). The Seller agrees to sell, and the Buyer agrees to purchase certain real property under the terms and conditions set forth below:

1. LEGAL DESCRIPTION

The Property to be conveyed by the Seller to the Buyer under this Contract is legally described in Exhibit A, attached hereto and made a part hereof.

2. PURCHASE PRICE

The total purchase price for the Property is \$30,000.00 to be paid by the Buyer to the Seller through Pioneer Title Agency located at 1550 East Missouri Avenue, Phoenix, Arizona 85014 with Jennifer Siverio serving as Escrow Agent, upon close of escrow.

3. BROKERAGE COMMISSION

The Seller has represented himself and has not been represented by a real estate broker, agent or agency to market and sell the Property. Seller is solely responsible for compensating costs contained within any agreements and hereby indemnifies the Buyer against any claim for commission (including all costs and attorneys' fees expended in defending against such claim) arising from or related to the transaction set forth in this Contract. This indemnity shall survive termination of this Contract.

4. RISK OF LOSS

Except as otherwise provided in this Contract, all risk of loss related to ownership and possession of the Property, including liability to third persons, shall be the responsibility of the Seller until the title and possession of the Property passes to the Buyer at Close of Escrow. Seller shall indemnify and hold Buyer harmless for all such loss, damage, liability, fees or costs of any kind whatsoever, except those caused by the Buyer. This indemnity shall survive termination of this Contract.

5. TITLE INSURANCE; CLOSING COSTS AND PRORATIONS

5.1 Buyer will pay all escrow fees related to the sale of the Property except as otherwise stated in this Agreement. Escrow Agent shall issue or cause to be issued a standard coverage owner's policy of title insurance in the amount of the purchase price and naming Buyer as

the insured. Buyer shall bear the cost of such title policy. The Seller shall be responsible for all property taxes and assessments levied and due against the Property prior to closing. The Buyer shall be responsible for all taxes and assessments levied against the Property after the closing date.

5.2 All of the above-referenced costs that are the responsibility of the Buyer shall be paid into escrow on or before the Close of Escrow in addition to the purchase price. All costs that are the responsibility of the Seller as referenced above shall be paid from the proceeds of the sale price to which the Seller is entitled.

6. <u>TITLE WARRANTY</u>

Fee Simple absolute title to the Property shall be transferred by the Seller to the Buyer at the Close of Escrow by General Warranty Deed, which shall include conveyance of all surface and ground water rights related to the Property. Buyer is only obligated to accept title to the Property at Close of Escrow if (1) the Property shall be free and clear of all defects, exceptions, easements, covenants, conditions, restrictions, mining claims, liens and encumbrances; and (2) the Buyer, at its sole discretion, is otherwise satisfied with the condition of title as reflected in the above-referenced title report and policy and any investigation made by Buyer pursuant to Paragraph 7. Buyer shall have until Close of Escrow to file its objections to the condition of title.

7. <u>INVESTIGATIONS</u>

Buyer shall have until ten days prior to Close of Escrow to make such investigations of the Property as Buyer deems necessary to assure Buyer that the Property is suitable for Buyer's intended purposes and that no hazardous wastes or substances are located on or under the Property.

8. SELLER'S REPRESENTATIONS, WARRANTIES, AND COVENANTS

Seller warrants, represents, and covenants (with the understanding that Buyer is relying on these warranties, representations, and covenants) that:

- 8.1. Except as reflected in the preliminary title report at the time of execution of the Contract, there are no claims, actions, suits, or other proceedings pending or threatened by any governmental department or agency or any other corporation, partnership, entity, or person whomsoever, nor any voluntary actions or proceedings contemplated by Seller, which in any manner or to any extent may detrimentally affect Buyer's right, title, or interest in and to the Property or the value of the Property or Seller's ability to perform Seller's obligations under this Contract.
- 8.2. Seller owns the Property in fee simple absolute, subject only to the matters reflected in the preliminary title report.

- 8.3. There is no pending or threatened condemnation or similar proceeding affecting any part of the Property, and Seller has not received any notice of any such proceeding and has no knowledge that any such proceeding is contemplated.
- 8.4. No work has been performed or is in progress at the Property and no materials have been furnished to the Property that might give rise to mechanic's, materialman's, or other liens against any part of the Property.
- 8.5. Seller is not prohibited from consummating the transactions contemplated by this Contract or any law, regulation, agreement, instrument, restriction, order or judgment.
- 8.6. There are no parties in adverse possession of the Property; there are no parties in possession of the Property except Seller; and no party has been granted any license, lease, or other right relating to the use of possession of the Property.
- 8.7. There are no attachments, executions, assignments for the benefit of creditors, receiverships, conservatorships, or voluntary or involuntary proceedings in bankruptcy or pursuant to any other laws for relief of debtors contemplated or filed by Seller or pending against Seller or affecting or involving the Property.
- 8.8. There is no default, nor has any event occurred which with the passage of time or the giving of notice or both would constitute a default in any contract, mortgage, deed of trust, lease, or other instrument which relates to the Property, or which affects the Property in any manner whatsoever.
- 8.9. There are no contracts or other obligations outstanding for the sale, exchange, or transfer of all or any part of the Property.
- 8.10. There are no violations of laws, rules, regulations, ordinances, codes, covenants, conditions, restrictions, instructions, or agreements applicable to the Property. Seller has not received notices from any insurance companies, governmental agencies, or any other person with respect to violations concerning the Property. If any notices of violations are received prior to Close of Escrow, Seller shall immediately submit copies to Buyer and Buyer's review and acceptance shall be a condition precedent to Close of Escrow.
- 8.11. Seller will not at any time prior to Close of Escrow grant to any person an interest in the Property.

9. OPENING OF ESCROW/CLOSE OF ESCROW

Opening of Escrow is defined to be the date that this Contract, signed by both parties, is delivered to the Title Officer. Close of Escrow shall occur on or before 60 days from opening of Escrow. Close of Escrow will be at the offices of the Escrow Agent set forth in Paragraph 2 herein. At the Close of Escrow, both the title to and possession of the Property shall be

transferred from the Seller to the Buyer. Any monetary encumbrances existing against the Property at the Close of Escrow shall be satisfied from the proceeds of the sale price.

10. EMINENT DOMAIN/CONDEMNATION

Should, for any reason, all or any portion of the Property be purchased prior to Close of Escrow by any government entity by eminent domain or condemnation, any proceeds from such transaction shall belong solely to the Seller. Upon condemnation of all or any portion of the Property, Seller shall be responsible to pay all escrow costs and fees related to this Contract and all rights and obligations of the parties under this Contract shall terminate.

11. USE OF SUBJECT PROPERTY

Seller shall have the exclusive right to use the Property until Close of Escrow. Seller agrees to maintain the Property through Close of Escrow in the same condition the Property exists at the execution of this Contract. Seller shall not remove any fixtures or improvements from the Property unless otherwise agreed to by the Buyer in writing. The Buyer does not have any right to use or enter upon the Property until completion of the Close of Escrow and transfer of title, unless otherwise agreed to by the Seller.

12. RIGHT TO ENCUMBER

As referenced above, the Property is to be free and clear of all liens and encumbrances at the time of transfer of title from the Seller to the Buyer. The Seller shall not voluntarily encumber the Property after execution of this Contract. Seller agrees that all encumbrances existing against the Property at Close of Escrow shall be satisfied from the proceeds of the sale.

13. ENVIRONMENTAL LIABILITY

Neither Seller nor, to the Seller's knowledge, any other person ever caused or permitted any Hazardous Material to be placed, held, located, or disposed of on, under, or at the Property or any part thereof or from the Property or any part thereof into the atmosphere or any watercourse, body of water, or wetlands and neither the Property nor any part thereof has ever been used (by Seller or, to the best of Seller's knowledge, by Seller's predecessors, or by any other person) as a treatment, storage, or disposal (whether permanent or temporary) site for any Hazardous Material. For purposes of this Contract, "Hazardous Material" means and includes any petroleum product and any hazardous substance or any pollutant or contaminant defined as such in (or for purposes of) the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act; any so-called "Superfund" or "Superlien" law; the Toxic Substances Control Act; or any other federal, state, or local statute, law, ordinance, code, rule, regulation, order, or decree regulating, relating to, or imposing liability or standards of conduct concerning any hazardous, toxic, or dangerous waste, substance, or material, as now or at any time hereafter in effect; and asbestos or any substance or compound containing asbestos, PCB's, or any other hazardous, toxic, or dangerous waste, substance, or material. Seller has not, nor to Seller's knowledge have Seller's predecessors or any other person installed any underground tanks.

- harmless from and against any and all losses, liabilities, damages, injuries, costs, expenses, and claims of any and every kind whatsoever, including reasonable attorneys' fees paid, incurred or suffered by, or asserted against, Buyer for, with respect to, or as a direct or indirect result of, the placement of any Hazardous Material on the Property by Seller, or an agent or employee of Seller, or the escape, seepage, leakage, spillage, discharge, emission, or release from the Property into or upon any land, the atmosphere, or any watercourse, body of water, or wetland of any Hazardous Material placed on the Property by Seller or an agent or employee of Seller, including, without limitation, any losses, liabilities, damages, injuries, costs, expenses, or claims asserted or arising under the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act, any so-called "Superfund" or "Superlien" law, or any other federal, state, or local statute, law, ordinance, code, rule, regulation, order, or decree regulating, relating to, or imposing liability or standards of conduct concerning any Hazardous Material which occurred because of the actions of Seller or any agent or employee of Seller while Seller owned the Property.
- 13.3 If the Property is found to contain hazardous wastes or substances in quantities unacceptable to the Buyer, or underground storage tanks requiring removal or abatement as may be determined by subsequent reports or inspection by independent experts hired by the Buyer, the Buyer has the right to terminate or rescind this Contract. However, all indemnifications shall survive termination or rescission of the Contract.

14. ASSIGNABILITY

Neither the Seller nor the Buyer may assign any of its rights or obligations under this Contract without the other party's advance written consent. This Contract shall be binding upon Seller and Buyer and their respective successors and assigns.

15. DEFAULT

- 15.1 <u>Default by Seller</u>: All provisions of this Contract are hereby deemed to be material. The Buyer shall have all rights and remedies available to it under Arizona law. Should the Seller breach any of the provisions under this Contract, Buyer shall immediately be entitled to the return of all amounts it paid pursuant to the Contract, to terminate the Contract, and to damages and to specific performance by Seller. Should Seller breach any provision of this Contract, the terms of this Contract shall not in any way be construed as a waiver of the Buyer's rights, as a municipal corporation, to obtain the Property by condemnation or eminent domain should the Seller fail to perform their obligations under this Contract.
- 15.2 <u>Default by Buyer</u>: All provisions of this Contract are hereby deemed to be material. The parties agree that Seller's remedies for Buyer's breach of this Contract shall be such rights and remedies available to them under Arizona law.
- 15.3 The breaching party shall be responsible to pay all escrow costs and fees related to this Contract.

15.4 The prevailing party shall be entitled to an award of all costs and attorneys' fees incurred should legal action be necessary by either party to enforce the terms of this Contract.

16. SUPERSEDING AGREEMENT

This Contract constitutes the entire contract of the parties relating to the Property and the parties agree that the terms of this Contract shall supersede all previous oral and written Contracts between them.

17. MODIFICATION

The terms of this Contract may only be modified upon written approval of all parties to this Contract.

18. SEVERABILITY

In the event any provision of this Contract shall be held invalid or unenforceable by any court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not invalidate or render unenforceable any other provision thereof.

19. ARIZONA LAW

Seller and Buyer both acknowledge that this Contract relates to property located in Navajo County, Arizona. Should legal action be necessary to enforce the terms of this Contract, all parties agree that the laws of the State of Arizona shall apply. All parties agree that the proper venue for any lawsuit shall be Navajo County, Arizona.

20. AMBIGUITY

This Contract was drafted by the City with the assistance of their attorneys. Neither the City nor its attorneys at the law firm of Pierce Coleman PLLC have rendered legal or other advice to Seller regarding sale of the subject property or the specific terms of this Purchase Contract. Seller is aware of its right to obtain independent professional and/or legal assistance with this Contract and, upon signing of the Contract, represents that they have taken all steps they deem necessary (including but not limited to, seeking the advice of professionals and/or attorneys) to assist them with this transaction. Consequently, the ambiguity in this Contract shall not be construed against either party.

21. <u>CONFLICT OF INTEREST</u>

The Seller recognizes that the Buyer is a political subdivision of the State of Arizona. Pursuant to A.R.S. § 38-511, the Buyer may cancel this Agreement within three (3) years after its execution without penalty or further obligation if any person significantly involved in initiating, negotiating, securing, drafting or creating this Contract on behalf of the Buyer is, at any time

while the Contract or any extension thereof is in effect, an employee or agent of the Seller in any capacity or a consultant to the Seller with respect to the subject matter of this Contract. Notice of any such cancellation shall be given by the Buyer to the Seller with respect to the subject matter of this Contract. Notice of any such cancellation shall be given by the Buyer to the Seller pursuant to the terms of A.R.S. § 38-511. Should cancellation occur under this provision, the Seller shall return to the Buyer all moneys paid by the Buyer under this Contract. Additionally, Seller shall be responsibility for payment of all escrow fees. Buyer shall convey back the Property to the Seller.

22. <u>AUTHORITY TO EXECUTE</u>

The Seller and Buyer both acknowledge that the persons whose signatures appear below have appropriate authority to execute this Contract on behalf of the Seller and Buyer. This Contract may be executed in several counterparts which together shall constitute an original.

23. NOTICES
