RESOLUTION NO. 1884

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF WINSLOW, ARIZONA,
URGING THE ARIZONA INDEPENDENT REDISTRICTING
COMMISSION TO ESTABLISH A LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT TO
KEEP RURAL ARIZONA TOGETHER**

WHEREAS, article 1, section 2, clause 3 of the Constitution of the United States of America orders a national census to be performed once every ten years; and

WHEREAS, 2 U.S.C. § 2a outlines the mathematical formula for determining how to calculate each state's representation in Congress based on total population, known as reapportionment; and

WHEREAS, the census information is distributed to the states, which is used to draw congressional and legislative district lines;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Proposition 106, approved at the 2000 general election, the Arizona Independent Redistricting Commission ("Commission") is charged with determining said reapportionment for congressional and legislative representation within the State of Arizona, and

WHEREAS, article 4, Part 2, Section 1 of the Arizona Constitution requires the commission to draw new district boundaries in a grid-like pattern across the state that must comply with the United States Constitution and Voting Rights Act, and to the extent practicable, accommodate the following five goals: 1) equal population; 2) geographic compactness and contiguousness; 3) boundaries that must respect "communities of interest"; 4) use of visible geographic features such as city, town and county boundaries; and 5) favor the creation of competitive districts without significant detriment to the other goals; and

WHEREAS, on October 28, 2021, the Commission approved draft maps for Arizona's nine (9) congressional districts and thirty (30) legislative districts with a 30-day comment period to follow before the Commission adopts the final maps in December 2021; and

WHEREAS, the Five Eastern Rural Counties of Graham, Greenlee, Gila, Southern Navajo and Apache, and adjacent communities of the Copper Corridor and Verde Valley have interests fundamentally different in nature, economically, culturally, historically, and in policy concerns than those of metropolitan regions and counties; and

WHEREAS, it is in the interest of the City of Winslow, as part of the Five Eastern Rural Counties, to remain united in political representation as a community of interest and separate from the metropolitan regions and counties.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WINSLOW, ARIZONA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. We join the other citizens and governments of the Five Eastern Counties in urging the Commission to establish legislative representation of this region that solely represents a rural and undivided district.

Section 2. We endorse and offer the attached base concept district proposal for the Five Eastern Rural Counties legislative district for consideration and adoption by the Commission, which is described as: The five Eastern Counties, along with greater parts of the Copper Corridor and Verde Valley, supplementing with northern Cochise, but connecting the San Carlos and White Mountain Apache nations with that of the Navajo and Hopi Nations via a strip of uninhabited territory of North Eastern Gila County and South Western Navajo County (Exhibit A).

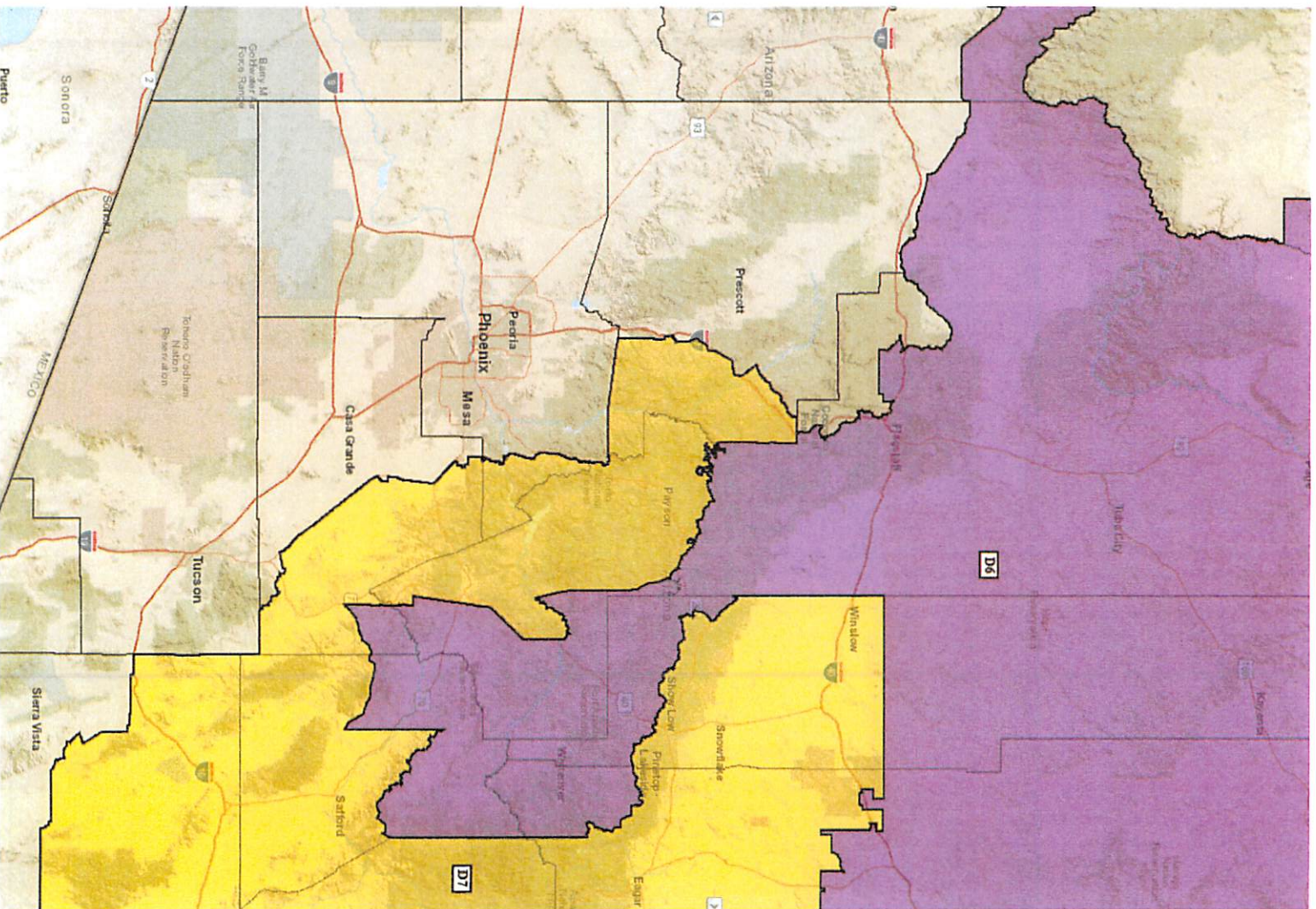


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
